Mr. McKinley's address to the faculty and the students of the University of Pennsylvania, on the 22nd of February, deserves a place among American classics. We doubt whether any more appreciative and affectionate tribute has ever been paid to the high character and the patriotic services of George Washington. We are quite sure that no President of the United States has given us a more sincerely patriotic utterance. Every citizen of this country, of whatever class in life aud without reference to political affiliations or opinion, can read it with profit and with pride.

Perhaps the most timely and significant feature of the address is that which refers to George Washington's views touching our foreign policy, and indicates their application to the present emer-

gency: "At no point in his administration does Washington appear in greater proportions than when he the foreign policy of the governjustice toward all nations; cultireligion and morality enjoin this conduct. Can it be possible that good policy does not equally enjoin it? It will be worthy of a free and enlightened and, at no distant period, a great nation, to give to mankind the magnanimous and too novel example of a people always guided by an exalted justice and benevolence.'

"Today, nearly a century from Washington's death, we turn reverentially to study the leading principles of that comprehensive chart for the guidance of the people. It was his unflinching, immovable devotion to these perceptions of duty which more than anything else made him what he was, and contributed so directly to make us what we are. Following the precepts of Washington. we cannot err. The wise lessons in government which he left us it will be profitable to heed. He seems to have grasped all possible conditions and pointed the way safely to meet them. He has established danger signals all along the pathway of the nation's march. He has warned us against false lights. He has taught us the true philosophy of a perfect union, and shown us the grave dangers from sectionalism and wild and unreasonable party spirit. He has emphasized the necessity at all times for the exercise of sober and dispassionate judgment.

"Such a judgment, my fellowcitizens, is the best safe guard in calm and tranquil events, and rises superior and triumphat above the storms of woe and peril."

This is the plea of the patriotpatriot-against the incendiary teachings of passion and ignorance and folly. He was educated in the common schools of the county, and at Dr. Miller's school at Taylorsville; served in confederate army and was severely wounded at Chancellorsville; was discharged from the army on account of his wound. He returned home and again took up his studies in Dr. Miler's school; studied law with Judge Armfield, was admitted to bar in 1868, and after two years practice was elected to the State Senate in 1870, and 1873 and again in 1882.; was elected to 54th and 55th Congress as a Republican, defeating one of the most active Democrats in the district. This district was always safely Democratic until this sturdy old mountaineer decided to capture her for his party.
