THE ISSUE TUESDAY

Next Tuesday is election day throughout the United States and the voters will be called on to express their choice for officers from justice of the peace to president of the United States.

President Wilson and Mr. Hughes are together on the principal issue, "Americanism."

In addition to the claim that the president's foreign policy has kept the country out of war, the Democrats are able to boast the completion of a legislative program that will make the president and his party famous for all time.

Mr. Hughes has declared for the right of Americans to travel on belligerent merchant ships and has announced positively that he will not interfere with the munitions traffic.

We know what Mr. Wilson has done. Mr. Hughes criticizes the president of the United States for a foreign policy that he says has not main tained American rights.

Both parties being almost together on all questions of domestic policy, though we know campaigners declare the contrary, the question simply is whether the people of the United States favor a more vigorous foreign policy, even though that would mean war, or whether they are willing to allow our foreign affairs to be conducted as Mr. Wilson has been conducting them.

AN EVENT IN WEST HICKORY

The formal opening of the assembly hall Friday night in West Hickory was an occasion worthy of note.

The Germans refuse to celebrate over the arrival of the Deutschland. They were handed a report that the Germans had reached the United States, celebrated the event lavishly and awoke to learn that they had been dreaming.

OVER FIVE THOUSAND FOR WEBB IS CLAIMED

Shelby, Nov. 4.—The Democratic organization of the ninth congressional district has prepared for the Daily News a formal statement, or forecast, of the result of the approaching election.

"We predict that Mr. Grene will get the following majorities in the following counties: Mitchell, 600; Avery, 450; Madison, 500; and predict that Mr. Webb will get the following majorities in the following counties: Yancey, 250; Burke, 200; Catawba, 150; Lincoln, 200; Gaston, 800; Cleveland, 1,200; Rocklenburg, 3,000; which gives a total of majorities for Mr. Grene, 1,550; and a total of majorities for Mr. Webb of 5,800.

"We find that the people of this district have attended the speakings in the largest numbers that we have ever seen, are thinking more of the importance of keeping our country out of war, and they are expressing their gratitude to Mr. Wilson for succeeding thus far. Of course, we find that a great majority of the people are happy over the present prices of everything they have to sell and the good pay for their wages. The farmers are deeply interested in the rural credits bill and the business men are happy over the federal reserve system. Our people don't want war and, regardless of party, are almost unanimously hoping and praying that such may be averted, and are expressing thanksgiving that Mr. Wilson has kept us out of it."
