WHEN THE WAR IS OVER

Relations of Belligerents as Financial London Foresees Them
London Correspondence in New York Evening Post.

It is only natural that, at times such as these, and amidst the heat of war, there should be much talk of a fierce crusade, even when peace arrives, against all kinds of German interests. I need scarcely say, however, that in common with the United States, the British are far too common sense and practicable a people to carry what might be termed personal animosity into business life. What, however, is going to tell against Germany in the future is not bitter hate on the part of her recent enemies, but something much more serious and lasting. This is profound distrust, it is something which can only be dispelled by Germany herself.

As sober and conservative people see it, the question at issue still is whether Germany will yet work out her own regeneration. That is for the German people to decide. For many years the German people have been the welcome guests of every civilized part of the world, and not least of Great Britain. What use was made of that hospitality and of the trust which is represented, the present war goes to show. If Germany desires to make her chief claim to power in the future her capacity for promoting the requirements of the outside world, then it is up to Germany to show that her power in that direction is sufficient even to quell the powers of Prussia.

INFANTILE PARALYSIS

"Is there anything that can be done for a child who has had infantile paralysis and who has been left a cripple?" To this question asked of the state board of health the following reply is given:

"Much can be done through persistently massaging the affected muscles. A prominent physician of this country says that by manipulation, if begun in time, shrinking of the limbs can often be prevented. The time to begin the manipulation of the affected limbs is as soon as the temperature returns to normal. In mild cases it is possible to begin massage within two weeks of the onset of the disease; in more severe cases it should not be begun till after the tender stage is passed, but it should not be deferred later than three months.

"A few years ago it was taught that if the case had been neglected for six months there was no hope of improvement. The teaching of the present time is that intelligent, persistent, patient, passive motion, manipulation, massage and muscle training will greatly improve some cases that have been neglected for years. There is no magic about the treatment; only patient, persistent manipulation of the affected muscles will get results."
