An embargo can be justified under the high price of foodstuffs, then an embargo might be placed on exports in order to spare suffering. Until that is the case, an embargo as a domestic policy would be disastrous to the great farming interests of the country and would bring want to mil lions of citizens who are due good prices for their products and whose good fortune should not be taken from them.

We have no idea, however, that Fitzgerald and his crowd will be able to pass such legislation through congress. President Wilson will oppose it with all his might and the American people, who believe in fair play, will not acquiesce in seeing friendly powers struck in the back. There are not enough of the kind of people Fitzgerald represents to pass an embargo bill through congress. We may be sure of that, but at the same time American citizens might do well to let congress know how they feel on the question.

Assuming that the United States government should pass distinctly hostile legislation aimed at a group of belligerent powers, such an act would call for counter-reprisals, and eventurally war might result. In that case the necessity Fitzgerald talks about would be nothing in comparison with the misery of the millions of workers in the factories and the loss of millions of dollars by the farmers. Peopie with money would have no trouble buying bread. There would be plenty of it.

Fitzgerald and the fellows who follow his reasoning complain bitterly at the British censorship of mails, but applaud when a German submarine sends a passenger steamer with crew and mail to the bottom of the ocean; complain about the interruption of our commerce, but offer no protests at the murder of our citizens. They would strike an underhanded lick at a friendly government, and they would risk bringing down on the people of the United States an unjustifible war in the eyes of all fairminded men.

### FRANCIS-JOSEPH

Just why ordinary human beings want to be kings, czars and emperors is difficult to comprehend, especially emperor of Austria-Hungary. His end came in the midst of the most destructive war of all time, caused by the assassination of the heir to his throne and his haste in avenging the murder. Very few

people envy the lot of an emperor. This is little reason to believe that the death of this monarch will change the attitude of Austria-Hungary to the war. The death of Francis-Joseph before the war began was expected to cause the Hungarians and Magyars to seek independence and a disruption of the empire was freely predicted. Austrians and Hungarians are bound together in a life and death struggle now, however, and any dismemberment that will come most likely will follow the close of


