BUCHAREST IN DANGER

Columbia State Now that the forces of Gen. Fal-kenhayn and Field Marshal Mackensen have joined hands in the plains of Wallachia, the citical position of Rumania becomes more apparent. There is in the situation but one grain of comfort for the allies—that the menace from the Dobrudja apparently has been eliminated by Mackensen's switching of his attack to the southern frontier of Wallachia. All else is gloomy for the Rumanians.

Only prompt and ample reinforce ments from Russia, together with demonstrations in force, by the en-tente armies in France, Macedonia and the Trieste region, can save the Rumanians the loss of their capital. Bucharest is strategically in no posi-tion to resist once the mountain passes have been forced and the strong barrier of the Danube has been crossed. That the Gemans have apparently accomplished, and now the fate of Bucharest hinges on whether the Rumanians can stop the Austro-German forces in the open fields

in Wallachia. It is entirely unlikely that the Rumanians will abandon their capital without the fight. Even now they are probably gathering their forces for a desperate stuggle, like Joffre's at the Marne, which will decide the immediate destiny of the campaign in this theatre. If the Russians can furnish reinforcements in the routh furnish reinforcements in the north and the east, while the other allies prevent Mackensen and Falkenhavn from drawing men from other fronts there is a chance for the Rumanian army; otherwise there is but small likelihood that it will be able to stem the tide. Bucharest will share the fate of Brussels and Relevande the fate of Brussels and Belgrade, the deadlock will be made the more complete, and the connection of the eastern and western halves of the Teutonic alliance will be virtually


