GETTING FACTS FOR HISTORIANS IN FUTURE

(By Associated Press.) Paris, Jan. 30.-The division of archives at the front has gathered more than 7,000 big cases of documents for the use of historians of the war. The final classification adopted covers 5,000 different subjects, and it is done with such fastidious pains that all the future historians will have to do is to name the subject or the part of the line where occurred the operations he

is studying to get a complete record. Besides these archives to the military operations, red tape methods have required the different units in the French army to furnish something like 25 million written documents since the beginning of the war. A single division of cavalry was called upon for 368,000 reports and statistical documents in two years; not one of them referred to the action of the livision in battle or at the front. These statistics are being used by the enemies of bureautic methods to foment a revolt against them.


