BILLS SHOULD PASS

Two bills in which the retail merchants of the state are particularly interested will come before legislative committees for hearing tomorrow afternoon—the garnishment law and a bill proposing to amend the constitution in regard to the homestead exemption law. Justice and honesty are on the side of the merchants, who desire only that they be given the same opportunity to collect accounts that are due them for value received. Since these questions have been before the general assembly for years, most people are familiar with them.

In the garnishment bill, the merchants ask only for the privilege of being allowed to draw upon a creditor for a fraction of his income each week until the debt is wiped out. The sheriff sells for taxes, but the merchant is bound to pocket his losses or charge them up to his honest customers.

The garnishment bill is a step in the direction of fair dealing. Its passage would be of immeasurable benefit to the people of the state, for, after all, they pay the bills of the deadbeats.

The Raleigh Times issued an extra Sunday afternoon, the Associated Press day wire being available on account of the great public interest in the international situation. That was a piece of enterprise on the part of the Times, and so far as we know there have been only two other occasions when afternoon papers came out with Sunday afternoon extras, the Times being the paper on each occasion. The Record probably will not issue a paper on Sunday, in spite of the demand, but if the situation warrants it the paper will receive and post bulletins on its windows.

One does not like to see the president's views overridden, but in the case of the immigration bill, containing the literacy test, the country should approve the action of the house and senate. We favor the exclusion of aliens as much as possible on the general ground that this country has more elements that it can assimilate, and we need a period in which they can be run through the melting pot. As a matter of fact the European governments will prohibit the emigration of the better class of people, and the other kind we do not need.

Some of our friends have chided us because we could not or would not follow the president's logic in all things, and may we assure those friends that Mr. Wilson and the nation will have no more loyal supporters than the Record. His magnificent action has removed any cause we might have had for not doing certain things which we believe a nation should do. But his has been the responsibility. Henceforth the whole country will fall in line behind him in the administration.

The American expedition demonstrated that it could remain in Mexico 10 months without wear of attack, and its withdrawal was accompanied by no incident calculated to cause the Mexicans to feel that they had forced withdrawal. We are glad the troops are on this side of the border.

Hickory is called on rather frequently to mourn the passing of beloved citizens. The death of Mrs. Marshall H. Yount, a young mother, causes distress to her many friends. She was lovely in form and sweet in disposition, and her presence will be missed in Hickory.

Colonel Roosevelt has offered himself and his three sons to the cause of his country, which shows that the colonel was not beefing all the time he was a critic of the administration. He is with the president now, however, as are all real Americans.

The seizure of a score or more of German merchant vessels means that the American government is not going to permit their crews to wreck these ships. It also means that from Berlin will come a protest and then something else.

The county commissioners, the board of education and superior court all convened at Newton Monday, but we are apt to lose sight of these necessary institutions in the course of a strenuous week.

These big headlines were not too large for the occasion, but there is no denying they help out a lot on a cold day when the office is frozen up and it takes a long time for the force to thaw out.

The Turkish grand vizier has resigned his job on account of ill health—and his relatives soon will find his body with a couple of holes in it.

MR. SUTTLEMYRE LIKES JOB AS LEGISLATOR

Representative E. G. Suttlemyre of Caldwell county passed through the city today en route to Raleigh. He has been with a visiting committee to the insane asylum at Morganton and stopped over at his home in Caldwell to spend a few days with his family. This is Mr. Suttlemyre's first experience as a legislator, but he likes it. For a few weeks a new member is kept busy learning the names and faces of members and of finding out how each other looks at life. There is something in this too, because when one is associated with a large number of men he wants to line up with the crowd that represents his ideals. Mr. Suttlemyre has had a bill passed to prohibit the killing and shipping

out of Caldwell county of heifer calves under six months of age and has had a bill passed to let the people of Caldwell vote on a bond issue of \$250,000 for roads. He also has had the corporate limits of Granite Falls extended and put the salary of the treasurer of his county at \$50 a month. The Caldwell man, who is a farmer, is on a number of committees—education, roads and turnpikes, cities and towns, agriculture privileges and election, agriculture, private and local laws and others—and has not found time, of course to meet with all.
