FRENCH GLASS INDUSTRY TAKING OVER GERMAN

(By Associated Press.)
Paris, Feb. 16.—The French glass
industry has succeeded in replacing glass laboratory receptacles that came from Germany before the war It was necessary to make an exhaustive study of the new glass because the composition differs from the German product and the chemist needed exact data as to the conditions under which it would be attacked by reactives and what resulting errors of analysis were to be feared. The work has been completed by M. Paul Nicolardot who declares the French glass to be fully equal to the German.


