BOYS ARE ARRESTED FOR THEFT OF RING

Nicholson and carrying off jewelry and silver several weeks ago. The charge against Hefner is receiving stolen goods, a diamond ring, identified by Mrs. Nicholson, having been in his possession. He says that he bought it from the Price boy for \$1.

Mrs. Robert Thomason saw Hefner with the ring and, suspecting that it was Mrs. Nicholson's, secured possession and returned to the owner.

Chief Lentz, who has been working on the case has not been able to induce the boys to make a clean breast of it, but the evidence is said to be strong against the boys.

After the recovery of the ring Dr. Nicholson employed Detective J. B. Shelhorse of Richmond and he and the local officers have been at work on the case.

For the purpose of holding the above primary and general municipal and library election which will be held on the First Monday in April, 1917. The City Council at its regular meeting appointed H. E. Whitener, Registrar; D. E. Whitener and C. H. Cline, judges of the election. Registration books will open March 1st, and remain open for 30 days.
