SWISS WILL RETAIN THE AMERICAN STAFF

(By Associated Press.)

London, March 9.—With the exception of three of the leading officials who were Americans, the staff of twenty-four formed under Ambassador Page to look after German interests in England, will be retained by the Swiss minister in London, who took over the protection of German affairs here when the United States broke off diplomatic relations with Germany. The three officials were heads of departments and their places have been taken by Swiss. Switzerland has been asked to send two specialists in sanitation to London, preferably army doctors, who will visit the German prisoners' camps in England, this being part of the duty transferred by the Americans when they gave up the work.

MEXICAN SENORITA TO RUN FOR CONGRESS

(By Associated Press.)

Mexico City, March 9.—Mexico will have at least one woman candidate for delegate to congress at the election to be held March 11. Miss Hermila Galindo, one of the prominent suffragists of Mexico has announced she will be a candidate for deputy from one of the districts of the federal district which includes Mexico City. Miss Galindo is the woman who presented to the constitutional convention an article providing for woman suffrage. This article was never acted on by the convention but Miss Galindo declares that as framed in the new constitution neither prohibits a woman from being a candidate nor from voting. This interpretation of the wording of the new constitution is not generally accepted but Miss Galindo has announced her determination to have her name placed on the tickets of her district as an independent candidate. Miss Galindo contends that the new constitution asserts it is the duty of each Mexican citizen to exercise the right of franchise and that as she is a Mexican she both has the right to vote and to be voted for.

EXPLOSION SERIOUSLY INJURED MECHANIC

Morganton, March 9.—Cicero Lindsay, a well-known mechanic, was seriously and perhaps fatally injured, here yesterday afternoon by the explosion of a gasoline engine or miller attached to a dough mixer at the Morganton bakery. He was severely injured about the head and hands, the extent of which has not yet been determined. He was taken to the Grace hospital and was still unconscious an hour later.

FIXING THE THERMOMETER

TO RAISE QUARANTINE AGAINST NEW YORK

(By Associated Press.) Mexico City, March 9.—It has been announced by the department of the interior that the quarantine in Mexico against the port of New York on account of infantile paralysis shortly will be raised and that passengers entering Mexico no longer will be subjected to the rigid examinations and disinfection process which have been customary.
