SWISS WILL RETAIN
THE AMERICAN STAFF (By Associated Press)

London, March 9.—With the excep-tion of three of the leading officials who were Americans, the staff of twenty-four formed under Ambassador Page to look after German interests in England, will be retained by the Swiss minister in London, who took over the protection of German affairs here when the United States broke off diplomatic relations with Germany. The three officials were heads of departments and their places have been taken by Swiss. Switzerland has been asked to send two specialists in sanitation to London, preferably army doctors, who will visit the German prisoners' camps in England, this being part of the duty transferred by the Americans when they gave up the work.




