IS RALEIGH PATRIOTIC?

When the third regiment paraded in Raleigh Sunday afternoon there was no shouting by the populace, though 10,000 people turned out to witness the spectacle.

There are two ways of looking at the thing. Four years ago every body would have been expected to throw his hat in the air and expand his lungs, at the same time nudging his neighbor and remarking that the United States "could lick the world."

But much has happened in four years. The troops were returning from the border at a time when they were likely to be called out for a more warlike service.

But we are not defending Raleigh people. One newspaper says they didn't show much patriotism and the other paper there says they did by their presence.

WHY NOT VACCINATE

The Record has not heard of a case of smallpox during the whole winter and early spring. A year ago there were many cases in this section, but vaccination was general and the good work done then has been effective.

SOUTHERN ROAD AFTER UNIVERSITY GRADUATES

Atlanta, Ga., March 29.—Opportunity for ambitious young southern men, university graduates preferred, to secure training which will fit them for responsible positions in the

freight traffic department of the Southern Railway System is offered through the apprentice squad which the Southern has organized in its general freight office at Atlanta.

The squad is now composed of eleven young men and, as it will be kept up to this number, openings for new members will develop as present members are promoted to other positions.

Authorities of leading southern universities have been asked to recommend deserving young graduates who may be listed for places on this squad but applications of young men who have only completed high school courses but are otherwise acceptable also will be given consideration.

At the start members of the squad are paid \$40 per month. After six months' service the pay of those whose progress has been satisfactory will be advanced to \$50 per month.

After that promotion will come to them as they make themselves capable of filling vacancies occurring in positions ahead of them, all such promotions being made on the basis of demonstrated fitness and ability.
