IS RALEIGH PATRIOTIC?

When the third regiment paraged

in Raleigh Sunday atternoon there was no snouting by the populace, though 10,000 people turned out to witness the spectacle. The question. now is, is Kaleign patriotic? There are two ways of looking at

Four years ago ever, body would have been expected to throw his hat in the air and expanshis lungs, at the same time nuos ing his neighbor and remarking that the United States "could lick the world." Four years ago Raleigh peopie probably would have done and said such things, and they would how have been unerent from other forks

But much has happened in four years. The troops were returning from the border at a time when they were likely to be called out 101 a more warlike service. The French people are said to be emotional, but as we remember, the Associated Press gave us very few accounts of cheering as the poilu, throwing down his books or tools, joined the colors and marched off to war. In 1870 the French were different.

The awidiness of war probably has been appreciated by Raleigh people, though none of them have seen it. They might have felt proud of the soldiers and yet not cared to raise a shout on the Sabbath, as they are reported to have done a few years ago at the mention of Woodrow Wilson's name.

But we are not defending Raleigh people. One newspaper says they didn't show much patriotism and the other paper there says they did by their presence. If they are not patriotic, they are at least curiouswe'il say that much.

WHY NOT VACCINATE

The Record has not heard of a case of smalipox during the whole winter and early spring. A year ago there were many cases in this section, but vaccination was general and the good work done then has been effective.

We are passing through the season of measles and pretty soon we are to enter the summer season when typhoid fever is prevalent, As in the case of smallpox there is a preventative for typhoid and the treatment is simple and cheap.

Persons who were not scratched last season should consult their physician now. It is better to prevent than to cure.


