## PATRIA BICKETT NAMES INSTITUTE FORCE

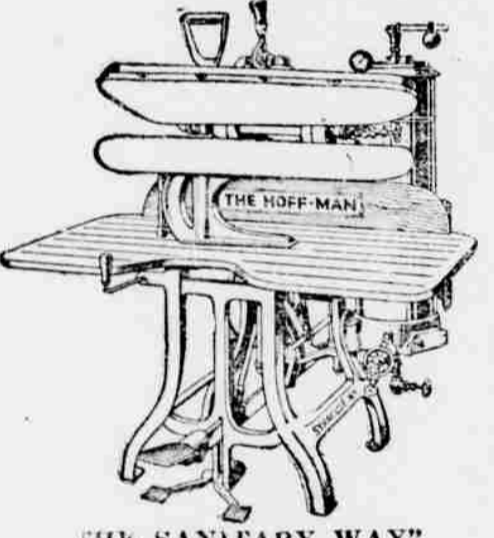

(By the Associated Press)  
Raleigh, April 23.—Governor Bickett today announced the appointment of institute conductors and examiners created under the recent act of the general assembly which requires the licensing of teachers of the first grade.  
The three women members are Mrs. T. E. Johnston of Salisbury, appointed for four years; Miss Hattie Parrott of Kinston, appointed for four years, and Miss Susie Fulghum of Goldsboro, two years.  
The men are Prof. A. T. Allen, superintendent of the Salisbury schools, two years, D. F. Giles, superintendent of the Wake county schools, two years, and Prof. J. H. Highsmith of the faculty of Wake Forest College, four years.  
Women members of the board draw salaries of \$2,000 annually, with \$500 expenses, and the men draw \$2,500, with the same expense money.

## BRITISH HOSPITAL SHIPS ARE SUNK

London, April 23.—The British hospital ships Donagel and LanFranc, with many wounded aboard, have been torpedoed without warning. They were sunk on April 17. Of those on the Donagel, twenty-nine were wounded men and twelve of the crew are missing. The LanFranc carried German wounded as well as British. Of those aboard, nineteen British and fifteen Germans are believed to have perished.  
The chancellor of the exchequer, Andrew Bonar Law, announced on April 19 in the house of commons that there had recently been further losses of British hospital ships, which would be published soon.

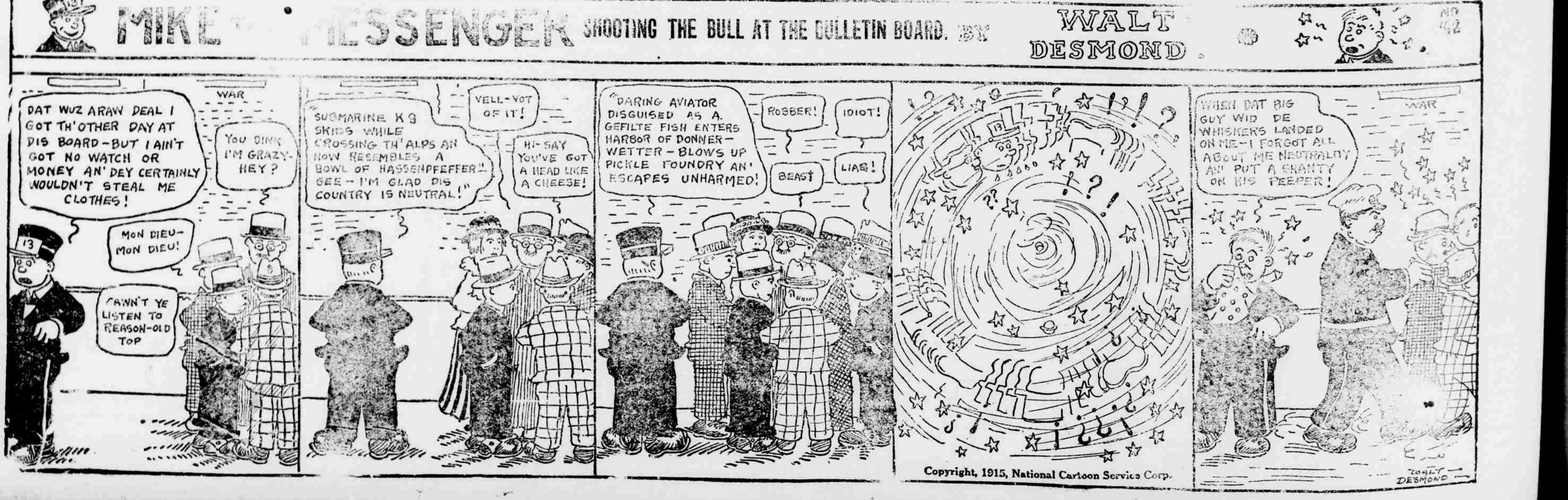
