

The council's reply will be presented at the Birmingham meeting and the general assembly is expected to decide whether to accept it as satisfactory or withdraw from the coun-

In its reply the council says: "It is our judgment that with a proper understanding of the situation there is no real line of cleavage between the princial of the Prasbyterian church in the United States and the constitution of the Federal council. We think it proper, however, to recommend that the Federal council clergy reaffirm its adherence to that absolute separation of church and state which is one of the cherished heritages of the great body of American Protestantism. Thec hurches of the Federal Council stand squarely upon this historic principle.'
