#### LEIGH ROBINSON MAKES DEDICATORY SPEECH

Gettysburg, Pa., June 8.--Leigh Robinson, a veteran of the Confederate army, and a native of Virginia, dedicated a monument to General Robert E. Lee on the Gettysburg battlefield today, declared that when the war between the states began the southern chieftain was offered two crowns, the crown of gold and the crown of thorns. "He lifted the latter to his brow and never was heard from him a murmur against the destiny of duty."  
"From 1865 to the day of his death," Mr. Robinson said, "General Lee was visited by every adversity a malign fate could hurl against him. From citizenship in the state of which

he was the consummate flower he was excluded. Practically outlawed, he died a paroled prisoner of war. A life wherein no responsibility was shirked; every reason for it met, he towered to the end, witnessing to the power of a great nature, greatly spent for others and in sacrifice of things mortal finding immortality. "Every gift of fortune had been showered on him, but he was greater than the gifts. Every blow of adversity was rained upon him, but he was greater than the blows." Mr. Robinson declared that one of the sublime moments of General Lee's career was when after Gettysburg he quickly assumed all the blame for the failure to break through the Union lines.  
Referring to the figures about the pedestal of the Lee monument, representing the different branches of


