AMERICAN STEAMER IS DESTROYED BY U-BOAT
New York, July 12.—The American steamship Kansas, carrying a crew of 50 men, has been sunk, presumably off the French coast, according to a cablegram received here by the France and Canada Steamship company, which chartered the vessel. The vessel was valued at \$3,000,000. She carried a cargo of flour and other foodstuffs, together with 4,000 tons of steel, which was valued in all at \$2,000,000, was consigned to the French government. A majority of her crew were Americans. The cablegram received here came from the company's agents in Paris. It did not say whether the steamer was torpedoed or where the sinking, on July 3, took place. The vessel was due at a French port on July 8, after the U-boat captain learned her identity. At that time the submarine was raiding shipping off the American coast. Formerly the Massachusetts, N. J., was built in Camden, N. J., in 1903. She was of 7,913 tons gross, returned to New York in April, where she remained until she started out in June. In October, 1916, the Kansas was held up by German submarine U-53 off Nantuxet; it was allowed to proceed after the U-boat captain learned her identity. At that time the submarine was raiding shipping off the American coast.
