### GOVERNMENT TO SEIZE ALL HUNGARIAN CROPS

Paris, July 13.—Announcement that the new Hungarian crops will be seized by the government of that country as soon as harvesting and threshing is completed has been made by the president of the Hungarian food administration bureau, according to a dispatch from Budapest. Farmers will be permitted to retain only sufficient of the crops for their private use and for seed. The monthly flour allowance for the rural population is expected to amount to 37 pounds for each person.

### BONDS SELL LOW


