RUSSIA'S OBJECTIVE

The Russian offensive which a week ago seemingly had as its object the capture of Lemberg, the capital of Austrian Galicia, has now entered on throwing the Austrians back against the Carpathian mountains, the capture of the passes leading into Hungary and the turning of the Austro-Germans out of Rumania so that the forces of General Sarrail, lying almost inactive at Saloniki for months, may yet be useful in cutting through from Macedonia to Russia and breaking the lines of communications between Turkey and Bulgaria.

This is an ambitious project and it may not succeed. From the energy with which the Germans are hurrying reinforcements from the western fronts there is evidence that they are afraid the Russians will succeed in their designs. The rough weather is hindering the Russians in their movements, the Cossacks are sweeping ahead, and in this connection it is interesting to recall that the Muscovites hold one of the several passes leading across the Carpathians.

A campaign of this importance will require several weeks to unfold, probably months to succeed, if all goes well, and the news from Petrograd will be of absorbing interest. There are no signs of weakening now, judging from the progress made, and the only question seems to be one of artillery supplies. Last year the Russians had enough munitions to carry them from June to October, and Petrograd has announced that the supply of shell this summer is greater than at any time since Russia entered the war.

PAYING FOR THE WAR

The Record has no scheme for raising revenue to prosecute the war without burdening the public. It realizes that the sinews of war must be raised, and raised largely from business enterprises. It had hoped, however, that the senate finance committee would amend the house war revenue bill so that the country could pay for the cost of the war over a period of years, instead of in a shorter time. To do this would not cripple industry.

Many textile plants in North Carolina and the south have not made any money until the last few years and just now are getting on their feet. The senate committee proposes to take the profits earned in these fat years from them.

Would it not be better for the nation if congress would arrange for the manufacturing establishments and individuals to pay for the cost of war over a period of many years? Certainly the winning of the war is as important to prosperity as it is to Americans of the present day.

Let the country pay for the war gradually and with least inconvenience to business.

The Record has been devoting most of its space for the last three issues to the names of those registered in Catawba county for the new national army. The last of the names are published today. The undertaking has been a large one, but we are confident the public appreciated the information.

While Hickory was still anxious for rain today, the country just outside of town was willing for a let up so that the plows might again resume operations.

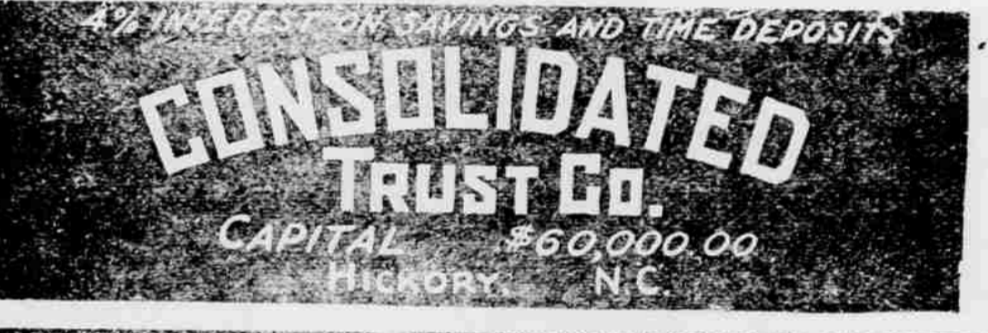
