EMBARGO STROG WEAPON

The announcement of Herr Erzberger in the reichstag that the high German command expected to obtain enough supplies from the Untied States through the neutral countries of Europe to supplement those produced within the empire itself serves merely to make President Wilsons' position all the stronger. The president's embargo was designed to prevent the enemy from obtaining supplies frm the United States and it seems to have hit a vulnerable spot.

The high German command, however, knew the supplies it would require from neutrals when war was declared, and the kaiser and his associates depended on neutral governments to block England in its efforts to prevent the illegal exportation of foodstuffs and munitions to the central powers. It is not likely that Germany counted on the United States taking steps to check trading with the enemy, for it must be remembered that German writers, with few exceptions. have held Americans up as a nation of traders, desirous of making money regardless of the cost.

President Wilson and the American nation have shown that sacrifices can be made in this country, that the people are willing to pass up a few million dollars and that they will fight vigorously with all the lawful weapons at their com-

### SAVE THE FOOD

In a letter to the Record, Secretary Houston of the department of agriculture urges the necessity of impressing on everybody the necessity for saving all foodstuffs possible this summer. The mere fact that there is plenty in the country today is no indication that in six months there won't be a shortage of many things necessary to the comfort of the American people.

The farmers of this country have enlisted in the war against Germany just as wholeheartedly as any other class of Americans, but everybody must help to save. Wheat is selling here now at \$2.50 a bushel owing to the food bill, and the American farmers will be guaranteed a minimum of \$2. Heretofore they have sold cheap while the speculator. walked off with the profits. With the passage of the good bill there is more reason for saving, because speculators will not be allowed to produce a condition that will impel farmers to sell.

It is most too late now to plant many things for winter use, but those things that have been wooed from the soil should be preserveu. They will mean money to the producers later on and contentment to the great host who are compelled to buy everything that goes on the ta-


