Albemarle, July 24.—A small son of Elijah Cooper was killed, Mr. Cooper himself is seriously injured and another son is badly shaken up as the result of a runaway on the streets of Albemarle here yester-day. The horse took fright at a motor truck and Mr. Cooper lost con-trol of the animal. The boy, who was about 12 years old, never recovered from the slock.

"Whereas, public safety and convenience require the permanent improvement of the roads, streets and highways, including the sidewalks, of the "City of Hickory:"

"Now, therefore, be it ordained: "That the "City Council of the City of Hickory" finds the following




