THE WAR SITUATION

A wave of pessimism must have swept over the country today at the news in the morning papers regarding the Russian situation and the alleged inability of the allies to break the German front in Belgium and France.

Although the Russian armies have been undermined by the friends of the republic—men who were misguided into believing that the peril was over with the dethronement of the czar—it is but truth to repeat that these same men are now bonding every effort to correct the great mistakes they have made.

As for the western front, the allies have proved that if they are unable to push the Germans out of France and Belgium, the Germans are unable to budge them.

The situation in Europe could be much worse for the cause of democracy, and there is no more reason to be pessimistic now than there was a few weeks ago.

NOT FIT TO GOVERN?

In connection with the pessimistic reports coming out of Washington, it is interesting to recall the attitude of the German governing class towards democracy.

The masters of Germany realize that the French, English and Americans may be capable of self government, but they deny that the German people have a similar capacity for self-government.

The death of Edwin J. Justice, formerly of Greensboro, removes a citizen of the state who had spent most of his life working for the interests of the people.

AFTER THREE YEARS

The war will have been raging three years on August 1. When the German war party decreed that France had to be thoroughly defeated and Russia beaten so as to insure the expansion of German kultur and dominion, the mighty combination of the entente was faced with confidence.

The Germans also hoped to defeat France in a few months. Even though they prepared for a long war, they did not believe that the entente group would cling together for many months.

Now after three years of fighting, the entente still holds together, although Russia is eliminating herself, and the most resourceful nation in the world comes to the front in her place.

In the present war, however, the strength of the enemies of the kaiser continues to increase, regardless of whether Russia continues in the war, and the entente armies on the western front are firmly on the initiative.
