THE WAR SITUATION

A wave of pessimism must have swept over the country today at the news in the morning papers regarding the Russian situation and the alleged inability of the allies to break the German front in Belgium and France. In consequence of situation the United States is expected to contribute many men order to make the entente power overwhelming in the west.

Although the Russian armies have been undermined by the friends of the republic-men who were misguided into believing that the peril was over with the dethronement of the czar-it is but truth to repeat that these same men are now bending every effort to correct the great mistakes they have made. The conference of soldiers' and workmen's delegates and the peasants of all Russia, in their zeal for liberty, unde, mined the morale of the army; now, however, they have given Kerensky every power to restore discipline. He may succeed.


