SOME FINE CORN

Ten acres of corn which everybody says is the best he ever saw is being grown by Mr. J. F. Abernethy on his place beyond Oakwood cemetery.

Mr. Abernethy will sow crimson clover between the rows in a few days and then await results. He made \$200 worth of hay from this land last spring, and the stand was poor except on two acres.

Many good farmers have inspected this 10-acre tract of corn and all agree that it gives promise of being the best raised this year or in any season.

Editor Frank Stroud of the Mocksville Record is bragging about his corn and beans, as if man lives on them alone, but he really ought to see the garden he was so sorry over a few months ago.

Department of justice agents will come to North Carolina to investigate the alleged treasonable remarks of Dr. H. Q. Alexander, president of the late Farmers' Union.

With the passage by the senate, 65 to 20, of a resolution to submit to the states the question of a constitutional amendment to prohibit the manufacture of liquor, the matter is put up to the house, where the leaders believe they can command the necessary two-thirds' majority.

"BUFFALO BILL" AT HUB SATURDAY

Following is an eye-witness description of the duel with knives between Col. William F. Cody, (Buffalo Bill) and Yellow Hand, chief of the Sioux Indians, which is accurately pictured in Essany's current feature, "Adventures of Buffalo Bill," which is featured at the Hub Saturday, August 4th.

"On July 18, 1876, at Hot Creek, near Fort Robinson, Dakotas," said Mr. Cross, "Buffalo Bill, guiding Gen. Eugene A. Carr and a detachment of United States troops drew up against the Sioux hordes. Yellow Hand, riding a yellow pony, rode out upon the crest of a high butte and signaled a bold challenge to Colonel Cody, whom he knew, to settle the difficulties by fighting a duel.

"Between the lines of soldiers and Indians the duel was fought. Cody fired the first bullet which clipped a feather out of Yellow Hand's war bonnet. Shot after shot was exchanged, and finally the men, their ammunition exhausted, leaped from their horses and clashed with knives. Five minutes of fighting and Colonel Cody drove his knife into the Indians' heart.

"Next day Yellow Hand's squaw went over to the soldiers' quarters and in the presence of the officers she cut off the third finger of her right hand. That was the supreme sacrifice act of a great chief's widow."
