HOPEFUL STILL

No man can foresee what Russia will do. As for us we are more hopeful than we were a few weeks before Korniloff's army started the drive in Galicia that began so auspiciously and wound up with a retreat over a great front.

The Russian soldiers are not yet convinced that Germany seeks to conquer their land, and when they end their retreat, as they will do—whether after the fall of Riga and Petrograd—they will begin to realize that it is a case of fighting to the end.

If Germany expects to make the most out of the Russian situation, her military leaders will have to change their psychology, they will retire from the occupied territory and allow the Russians to stew in their own pot.

AN OLD TRICK

Emperor William borrowed a trick from Bismark when he tendered his congratulations to the Bavarian troops who met the Franco-British onslaught in Flanders, the great chancellor having a knack of passing bouquets at points where they would do most good.

There is a reason for that of course. These troops have borne the brunt of many attacks and they have been called on to do the major work for the Prussians; the emperor therefore feels that he must hand them a few in order to compensate the people back home for the losses they have sustained.

Whereas Bismark placed his wreaths infrequently, the present German emperor appears to be overdoing it. Fate was unkind to the Anglo-French forces in Flanders. Just as they had everything going their own way the flood gates were opened and a deluge resulted that turned the extremely low country into bogs and marshland.

This section has been receiving its share of the beneficent sunshine, but most of the time the rays have been tempered by clouds which march between earth and heaven in the early afternoon—incidentally being a part of the demonstration that cuts off the juice and causes more gray hairs in our ancient head, for fear the paper wont get out on time.

ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF WATER WORKS BONDS

Whereas, the public health and convenience require the improvement and extension of the water works system of the City of Hickory:

(a) That the city treasurer has filed with the city manager, ex-officio city clerk, a statement of the debt of the "City of Hickory," pursuant to the "Municipal Finance Act of 1917," and that said statement is now in the office of the city manager and is open to public inspection.

(b) That the average assessed valuation of property subject to taxation by the "City of Hickory" for the years nineteen hundred fifteen, nineteen hundred sixteen and nineteen hundred seventeen is two million, one hundred eighty-one thousand, six hundred forty-two dollars, and sixty six and two thirds cents (\$2,181,642.66 2-3), as is shown by said statement.

(c) That the average assessed valuation of property subject to taxation by the "City of Hickory" for the years nineteen hundred fifteen, nineteen hundred sixteen and nineteen hundred seventeen is two million, two hundred ninety-six thousand, two hundred forty-nine dollars and thirty-three and one-third cents, (\$2,296,249.33 1-3), as is shown by said statement, and that the years nineteen hundred fifteen, nineteen hundred sixteen and nineteen hundred seventeen are the three fiscal years in which taxes were last levied.

(d) That the amount of the net debt of the "City of Hickory" outstanding, authorized and to be authorized (including all proposed bonds) is two hundred two thousand, eight hundred forty-three dollars (\$202,843.00), as is shown by said statement.

"That water works bonds of the maximum principal amount of fifteen thousand dollars, bearing a maximum rate of interest of five per centum per annum, be and are hereby authorized to be issued by the "City of Hickory," a municipal corporation in Catawba county, State of North Carolina, for the purpose of constructing additional service mains and for other additional extensions and improvements of the water works system, of said municipal corporation, except service connections.

"That the maximum period within which the said water works bonds shall mature is and shall be thirty years, the probable period of the usefulness of the improvement aforesaid.

"That a tax sufficient to pay the principal and interest of the bonds aforesaid shall be annually levied and collected.

"That this ordinance shall take effect thirty days after its first publication, unless in the meantime a petition for its submission to the voters is filed under the "Municipal Finance Act of 1917," and that in such event it shall take effect when approved by a vote of the majority of the voters of the city." 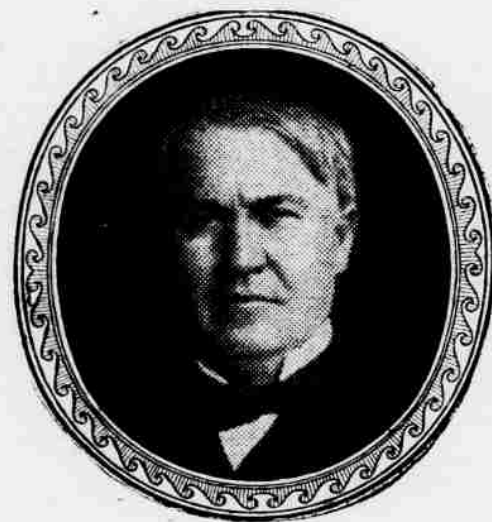
