NEW SECRETARY IS SENSIBLE FELLOW HUGE MUNITION FACTORY IS BURNED

Amsterdam, Aug. 6.—In a character sketch of Dr. Richard von Kuehlmann—just appointed German secretary of foreign affairs—the Nieu Courant of The Hague says that Dr. von Kuehlmann has always been a vigorous opponent of submarine warfare. He is also, says the newspaper, a disciple of doing everything possible to prevent the further alienation of Great Britain, believing that her friendship is necessary to Germany.

By the Associated Press. London, Aug. 6.—According to reports received from the German frontier by the Exchange Telegraph at Amsterdam, the explosion at Henningsdorf was one of the worst catastrophes of its kind that has happened in Germany since the war began. A munition factory was wiped out, 300 persons were killed or injured and great damage done. Henningsdorf has been isolated.

ITALIANS STOP AN AUSTRIAN ATTACK

By the Associated Press. Rome, Aug. 6.—Italian troops in attacks on the Julian front yesterday extended the Italian lines south of Boscomalo. There also was spirited fighting on Mt. Rombon, where Austrian attempts to win an Italian position was definitely negated by the Italians.

FERGUSON'S TRIAL DELAYED FEW HOURS

By the Associated Press. Austin, Tex., Aug. 6.—M. M. Crane, counsel for the house in the impeachment charges brought against Governor Ferguson by Speaker Frank Fuller, sprang a surprise today when he asked the governor to take the witness stand first. This Governor Ferguson refused to do, claiming his constitutional right to hear the evidence. On the plea that this refusal disarranged his plans, the hearing was adjourned until 3 o'clock this afternoon.

LEAVES SOCIALIST PARTY

New York, Aug. 6.—Chester M. Wright, former editor of the New York Call, the Socialist organ in this city announced he had resigned from the socialist party because he considered the party's attitude "entirely wrong" as it relates to the labor movement and to the war.

U-BOAT RUMOR IS HEARD IN NEW YORK

By the Associated Press. New York, Aug. 6.—A report that a U-boat has been sighted off the Atlantic lane off this port caused the war department to close the port gate at midnight. It was opened again at 6 o'clock.

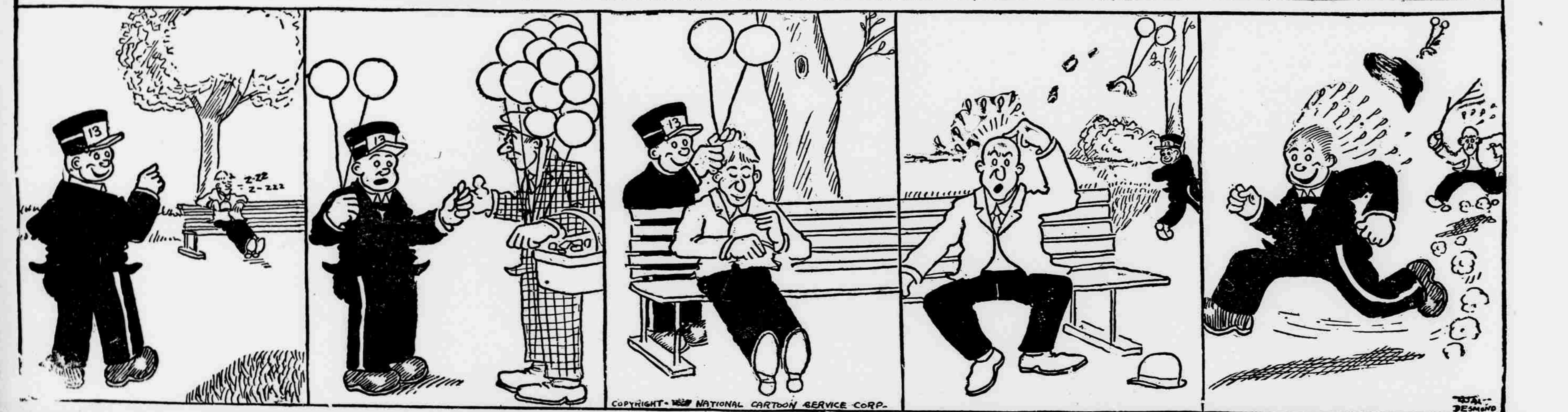
TO PREACH WEDNESDAY EVENING TO SOLDIERS

TRY RESISTERS OF TREASON CHARGE By the Associated Press. Muskogee, Okla., Aug. 6.—District Attorney W. P. McGinnis announced this afternoon that the men arrested on the charge of resisting the draft in connection with the Oklahoma uprising will be tried for treason and that the death penalty will be asked by the governor. District Attorney McGinnis said United States marshals were searching out the alleged traitors.

SUMMERS SENTENCE COMMUTED TODAY By the Associated Press. Raleigh, Aug. 6.—The three years' sentence of Dr. J. W. Summers of Charlotte, convicted of manslaughter in August, 1916, after a sensational trial on the charge of malpractice in causing the death of a young woman of Greensboro was commuted to a fine of \$1,000 today on the condition that he do no practicing for three years. Dr. Summers is 64 years old.
