NEW YORK TROOPS NOT TO LEAVE SOON

Washington, Aug. 6.—The departure of the 27th division, United States army, which is composed of national guardsmen, will be delayed until September 1, according to Major General O'Ryan, who said that he had received word from the war department today that the camp at Spartanburg, S. C., would not be ready before that time.

The farewell parade of the various units which was to take place here Thursday has been indefinitely postponed as a consequence. The parade probably will be held in three weeks.

FOUR-MINUTE MEN IDEA ADOPTED AT FAYETTEVILLE

Fayetteville, Aug. 7.—State Senator John A. Cates has accepted the chairmanship of the Four-Minute Men association for Fayetteville at the request of the state council of defense, and has appointed W. F. Blount and R. S. McNeill as his assistants on the committee. The object of the association is to assist in the conduct of the war through addressing and informing the people as to matters concerning the world struggle. The moving picture theatres of the city have offered their houses to Mr. Cates for four-minute addresses by prominent men. A patriotic rally at the LaFayette theatre is planned for a later date.

INCREASE NUMBER ON I. C. COMMISSION

Washington, Aug. 7.—Awaiting President Wilson's signature today were bills to increase the interstate commerce commission from seven to nine and to enable the president to have a firmer control on the internal situation as regards transportation. Conference reports on both bills have been agreed to.

MANY ABSORBING SCENES ARE SHOWN IN "THE BEAUTIFUL LIE"

"The Beautiful Lie," the Metro production starring Frances Nelson, to be seen at the Pastime theatre on Wednesday, August 8th is a great poem dramatized. Presented by B. A. Rolfe, it has been adapted for the screen by June Mathis from Ella Wheeler Wilcox's famous poem, "A Reverie in a Station House." Sections from the most dramatic portions of the poem are flashed on the screen.

Powerfully contrasting scenes are shown in "The Beautiful Lie." One of the most interesting of these is of a police court where women offenders are arraigned. Here Louise Joyce (Frances Nelson) is brought under a false accusation, and thrown in among criminals. Later she becomes an artist's model and the production shows typical scenes in New York's "Bohemia." A painting of Louise as an "ice maiden" figures prominently. Advised by Mary, an unfortunate woman who aids her when she is in need, to take all and give nothing, she presents a cold exterior to all men, and is painted in the character of the ice maiden by Paul Vivian, a young artist. A yachting trip taken by a prominent architect and his group of bon vivants adds to the colored scenes with which this gripping photoplay is filled.

LIBERAL PRESS OUTSPOKEN AGAINST CABINET SECTION

Copenhagen, Aug. 7.—The liberal press of Germany is outspoken in its disappointment over the selections Chancellor Michaelis has made of his colleagues in the new imperial and Prussian ministries, which are of names only and not of the system. All the papers of this class agree in the view that there is not a trace of parliamentarism in the new order of things.

It is evident, comments the Vossische Zeitung, that the course is set to the right about from the liberal ideas now inspiring the people. Vorwaerts, the socialist organ, speaks of the new administration as one of "enlightened bureaucracy." The Tageblatt characterizes the new ministers as in the main successful administrative officials. The nomination of two members of parliament cannot, it says, be regarded as even a step toward parliamentarism because in the first place neither of the two is particularly liberal in his views or a strong believer in reforms in the direction of liberalism, and in the second place both must, under the present constitution, resign their seats.

Dr. von Kuehlmann alone of the new officials is given favorable treatment by the liberal organs.
