RUMANIA'S SIDE

"The Justice of Rumania's Cause" is the title of a booklet written by A. W. A. Leeper and sent out to the newspapers of this country in the hope of having placed before the world the motives that actuated the Latin kingdom in entering the war against Germany and her allies.

Rumania, Mr. Leeper points out, went to war primarily to free Transylvania, largely inhabited by Rumanians who have a prior claim to the land, from Austrian and Magyar domination.

At this great distance it is impossible to grasp all the ramifications of Balkan Europe, the countless nationalities, the strivings for independence, for freedom of worship, for he right to the ballot, and for agrarian reforms.
