American Patience Has Its Limit
New York Herald.
Premier Kerensky testifies to the deep interest Russia is taking in America and the eagerness of Russia to follow America's lead in an exclusive interview cabled to the Herald by Mr. Herman Bernstein from Petrograd. "I wish," says Mr. Kerensky, "that the great American democracy would especially at this moment come to our assistance energetically." Russia, Mr. Kerensky makes clear, is in sore need of material and moral support from this country. He and his associates in the government are not discouraged over the outlook, but it is evident that they are fearful of the possible effect upon the Russian masses of the reports of peace movements in the United States. Unquestionably it is the aim of the LaFollettes and other workers for Germany to contribute aid to Germany in her campaign to undermine Russia. Can there be any other explanation in their persistence in talking peace at this time? Mr. Russell says to them:

"Every pacifist in this country who goes about prattling of peace, every member of congress who introduces a peace resolution, every senator who is playing the German game is doing far more harm to the United States, to the cause of democracy, to the ideals of his country than a million German soldiers on the battle line can do."
In the past the American people have been not at all squeamish in their dealings with those persons who have endeavored to stab their country and its armies in the back. It would be well for Mr. LaFollette and his co-workers for Germany, male and female, to turn back the pages of their histories and refresh their memories concerning the treachery which Americans of other days accorded to Tories and copperheads and traitors.
