### KEEP VEGETABLES BY STORAGE

The storage of vegetables is an economy for those who grow them in sufficient quantities for the needs of the family.

To care for the surplus vegetables in many cases requires nothing more than the use of existing facilities in or near the home.

Often the vegetables from a small garden may be stored with no outlay of money. When considerable quantities of vegetables are grown, it is frequently advisable to construct permanent storage facilities in the form of a storage room in the basement of the dwelling or under an outbuilding or to build an outdoor cellar of wood or masonry.

If permanent facilities are not available the root crops can be kept in outdoor pits or banks, requiring no cash outlay except for labor.

### ECONOMIC POSITION IN NORWAY

Christian Science Monitor. Every one will remember the story in "Robison Crusoe" of how a ship was wrecked on a reef off the island, and Crusoe, after many attempts, succeeded in reaching it; how he made his way around the ship, seeing what he could find that might be useful to him, and finally came across a great chest full of gold pieces; how he took up the pieces, letting them fall through his hands, with the dull recollection of how utterly valueless they were to him, situated as he was.

This story very aptly sums up the position of Norway, as brought out in a recent statement made by Mr. Thorne Holst, the well-known Norwegian commercial and industrial authority. Mr. Holst pointed out that while it is undeniable that Norway through her increased trade and manufacturing has been accumulating money, nevertheless she has not been accumulating wealth. Money, as such, he very justly insists, is not wealth; and the cost of living has increased to such an extent in Norway as in practically every other country throughout the world, that very many of the people, far from being better off, are really worse off than they were before the war. Of course, the present conditions have dealt most hardly with those people who have fixed incomes, and when the present cost of food, clothing, and fuel is taken into consideration, it is seen how serious their position must be.

As is inevitable at such times, the inequality in the distribution of wealth in Norway has been steadily increasing with every month of the war, and, as Mr. Holst points out, it is becoming daily more evident that vast accumulations are, in many cases, coming into the wrong hands. This is, in a measure, the kernel of the difficulty.

The one reassuring feature of the whole situation is that this increase in Norway's trade is not entirely due to the war. For some time past, the country has been steadily prospering in this direction. Thus the value of Norwegian exports alone increased from 58,500,000 crowns in 1904, to 181,500,000 crowns in 1913, showing an increase of over 300 per cent in nine years. The conditions which produced this prosperity are not likely to be permanently impaired by the war, and in spite of all her present difficulties, given wisdom and restraint amongst her statesmen and commercial leaders, the future of the country need occasion no undue concern.

### PROVIDE WINTER POTATOES

Save late Irish potatoes by storing them in a room in the cellar, or in an outdoor storage bank or pit.

When stored in cellars, the potatoes may be put into barrels, boxes, baskets, crates, bins or on the floor, but must be protected from the light.

Select a well-drained location, make a shallow excavation about 6 inches deep, line it with straw, hay, leaves, or similar material, and place the potatoes in a conical pile on the lining. Make the bottom of the pile about the same size as, but not larger than, the bottom of the excavation.

Cover the potatoes with the same material as that used for lining the bottom of the pit and carry it up several inches above the apex of the pile of potatoes, having it extend through the dirt covering. This serves as a ventilating flue, and it should be covered with a piece of tin or a short board as a protection from wind.

The dirt covering should be 2 or 3 inches thick when the vegetables are stored, and it should be increased as severely cold weather approaches until it is a foot or more in thickness, or sufficient to protect from freezing. In finishing the pit, the dirt should be firmed with the back of the shovel in order to make it as nearly waterproof as possible.

The shallow trench around the base of the pit should have an outlet for carrying off the water. Supplement the dirt covering with manure, straw, corn fodder, or other protective material. Use several small pits instead of one large one, as vegetables keep better in small pits, and the entire contents can be removed when the pit is opened.
