HOME RULE FOR IRELAND

Charity and Children. We labored long under the delusion that the government of Great Britain was most unjust in refusing to grant to Ireland the same measure of freedom that Scotland enjoys and our sympathies were on the side of the Irish patriots who have struggled through long and weary years for home rule and whose hopes have always turned to ashes. But as is true of so many other questions, after some careful study of the situation, another side has appeared. There is a reason and a good one for withholding the boon of home rule from the Irish people. And the reason is that Ireland is by no means a unit for home rule. If the people had been solid they would have had their wishes long ago.

worst. Delinquency in war time is now found alone in civil life. It crops out in the ranks and often manifests itself on the field of battle. The commander of more than one unit under fire has found it necessary to detail men in the rear to pick up skulkers or malingerers.

If all men were brave, strong and true, war would not leave such an impress of evil, it not as calls the best of the country's youth in action it is the bravest of the brave, those of the most sterling stamina, moral and physical, who take the desperate chances of course suffer the greatest hardships.

We need not be disheartened by such evidence of timidity or indifference as now appear in many places. They are symptomatic of human beings and being witnessed in much larger proportion is proof of human fortitude and devotion. The pay of it is that while the shaker survives perhaps he becomes the progenitor of others of his kind, the man of courage and faith is too often lost to the world.
