



THE NUMBER OF SHIPS SUNK SHOWS INCREASE

London, Aug. 23.-The number of British merchantmen sunk by submarines or mines in the last week was only slightly larger than the previous week, when a considerable fallthe effort to make good the shortage ing off was noted. According to the official statement, 15 vessels or more than 1,600 tons were sunk and three vessels of less than 1,600 tons, in addition to two fishing vessels, as compared with 14 large vessels the previous week, two small vessels and three fishermen.
