NEWSPAPERS AND PUBLIC

Senator Hardwick, who does not happen to be very popular with newspapers, and whose love for them does not pass the understanding, is endeavoring to make capital out of the fact that publishers are given a low postage rate.

In our opinion the government could do nothing more helpful and instructive than to make it easy for newspapers and periodicals to pass from one section to another.

ITALIANS NEAR TRIEST

From the best information, although the Rome bulletins are noncommittal, the Italian army is within 12 or 15 miles of Triest, the great Austrian seaport on the Adriatic.

The country over which the Italians are advancing, however, is rugged and mountainous and offers a thousand shelters for the Austrians, who have been reinforced heavily in the last few days.

The capture of Triest undoubtedly is the objective of the Italians, but whether they will be able to win this stronghold in the next few weeks remains a question that cannot be answered.

Some of our friends who are complaining that "freedom" is denied them are reminded by the State Journal of Raleigh that they cannot even cross the street in many cities except by permission of some officer of the law.

Those who have watched the soldiers drill have noted how quickly raw recruits are transformed into agile steppers.

Hickory high school boys are intensely interested in military training and they will be at the Chamber of Commerce tonight to secure blanks for their signatures.

Evidence accumulates that Russia will remain until the end. Part of this evidence is vigorously fighting on several fronts in which the Russian armies are giving a good account of themselves.

The war department will call only five per cent of the first quota of 687,000 men summoned for the national army and very few men will be taken from employment for several weeks.

For our part we are glad Company A is allowed to remain with us a while longer. The boys are part of the life of the town, and they would be badly missed.

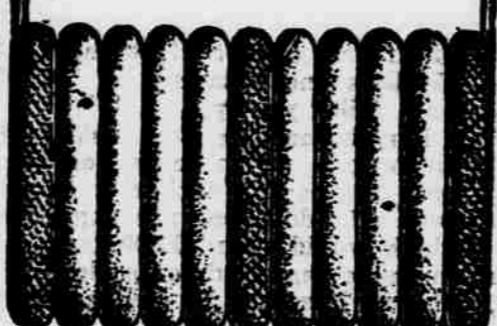

STANDARDS USED IN FIRE PREVENTION

NATIONAL FIRE PROTECTIVE ASSOCIATION HAS WELL DEFINED OBJECTS IN VIEW.

CAMPAIGN AGAINST FIRES

Associations Activities Provide For an Opportunity For Every Man to Perform Some Sort of Service.

The National Fire Protective Association is an organization formed with two well defined objects in view, and to a large extent its work has divided in a natural way, but with full cooperation between the two branches. The technical branch has performed a splendid service in giving to the country standard specifications for anything relating to fire prevention or protection.

From this brief statement of the Association's activities you will see that there is an opportunity for every man to perform some sort of service.

Objective View.

1. The adoption by municipalities of the Standard Building Code of the National Board of Fire Underwriters to the end that fire resistive building construction may be encouraged, the use of inflammable roof coverings prohibited, adequate exit facilities from buildings assured, and interiors so designed and fire-stopped as to make easy the extinguishment of fires therein.

2. The adoption by all States of minimum building requirements for the protection of state and county hospitals, asylums and similar institutions outside city limits and of small communities in which the establishment and enforcement of a building code is impracticable.

3. The adoption of the Association's suggested ordinance providing for the systematic inspection of all buildings by city fire marshals or local firemen to insure the vigorous enforcement of rules for cleanliness, good housekeeping, and the maintenance of safe and unobstructed exits, fire fighting apparatus and other protective devices.

4. The enactment of ordinances similar to that of Cleveland, Ohio, fixing the cost of extinguishing preventable fires upon citizens disregarding fire prevention orders, and a more general legal recognition of the common law principle of personal liability for damage resulting from fires due to carelessness or neglect.

5. The wider general use of the automatic sprinkler as a fire extinguishing agent and life saver and the more general adoption of the fire division wall as an important life-saving exit facility.
