As this was written Monday night there was hope that the linotype pot would be put in running order after a breakdown almost on the eve of the second anniversary of the paper. Regardless of this trouble, however, the paper will appear in modified form, thanks to the kindness of friends here and at Newton. The Record was born on September 11, 1915. We had intended telling our readers of the second year of the Record, but they know almost as much about it as we do. Considering the higher cost of everything of which a newspaper is made, paper in particular, the year has been a success. No money has been made, but the paper has grown in circulation and in the goodwill of the people of a large community in and around Hickory. Although the paper has not made any mechanical improvements in the two years of its existence, it has become a better newspaper. All members of the staff are more accustomed to their work, the editor has become more familiar with the needs of this community, and can speak with more understanding than he could a year ago. That the paper has been appreciated is attested by the increased circulation and the liberal advertising patronage. The character of the Record should be well known by this time. It is here to serve Hickory, Catawba county and this section and to do its part in the wholesome development of this section of North Carolina.
