KORNILOFF A PATRIOT

The Russian situation may be more serious than any of us can realize at this distance, but it is noteworthy that General Korniloff espoused the cause of the revolution along with General Brussiloff and other leading Russian commanders.

When the conference was held at Moscow General Korniloff demanded that discipline be restored in the army and enforced on the civilian population. He declared that anarchy would result if this was not done.

Korniloff told the conference that officers in 10 regiments had either been murdered or deeply humiliated by the men, and he asked for authority to repress mutiny. This was not given.

So far as we know Korniloff and the other Russian generals are as patriotic as Premier Kerensky and his followers. The supremacy of Korniloff might result in restoring order in Russia.

THE RUSSIAN MUDDLE

If the American public knew that Korniloff is standing on the side of the revolution, they could sympathize with him in his efforts to restore some semblance of order in Russia and the armies.

The clash of authority was to have been expected and the strongest man probably will win. If he is the right kind of man, he will restore order and begin the huge task of preparing Russia for its responsibilities in the family of nations.

It is a tragedy that the really strong men in Russia would not pull together, but there are elements in the situation that are no more discouraging than the news that has come from Russia in the last few weeks.

Hickory people will turn out in large numbers to hear Dr. Simon Peter Long of Mansfield, Ohio, at Lenoir College Thursday night, but they will not confuse his appearance here at this time with his visit September 25, when he will make three addresses in Hickory.

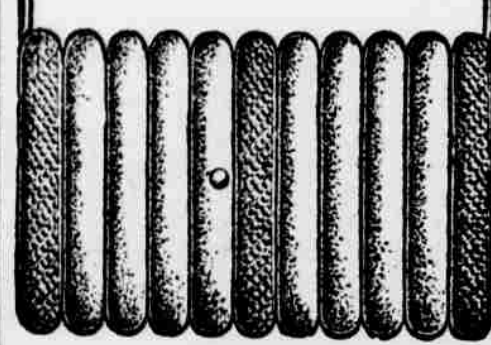

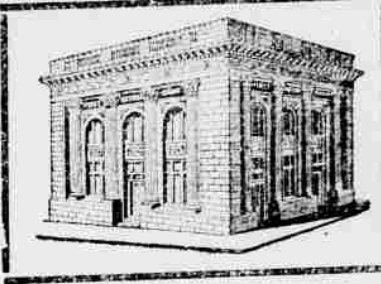

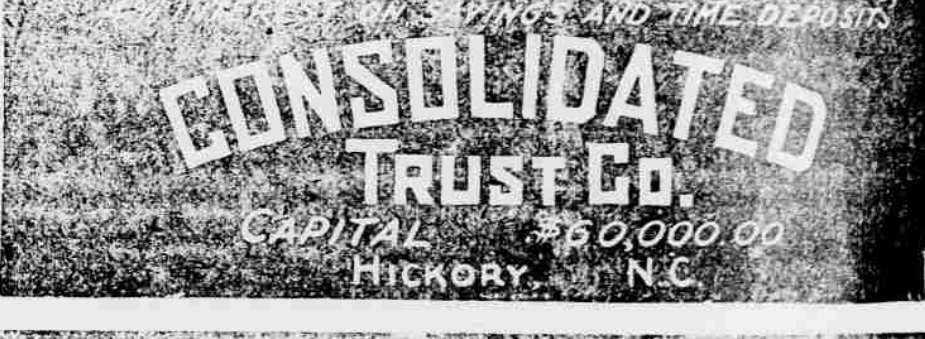
