"Whereas, public safety and conenience require the permanent imrovement of the roads, streets and ghways including the sidewalks, the City of Hickory.' (a) That the city treasurer has iled with the city managen, ex-

officio city clerk a statement of the lebt of the "City of Hickory" puruant to the "Municipal Finance Act of 1917," and that same statement s now in the office of the city manager and is open to public inspec-

(b) That the average assessed valuation of property subject to taxation by the "City of Hickory" for ourteen, nineteen hundred fifteen nd nineteen hundred sixteen is two nillion, one hundred eighty-one thousand, six hundred forty-two do'lars, and sixty-six and two-thirds cents 8,181,642.66 2-3), as is shown by

(c) That the average assessed aluation of property subject to taxation by the "City of Hickory for the years nineteen hundred fifeen, nineteen hundred sixteen and ineteen hundred seventeen and nillion, two hundred ninety-sia housand, two hundred forty-nine dollars and thirty-three and one-third cents (\$2,296,249.33 1-3), as is shown by said statement, and that the years ineteen hundred fifteen, nineteen undred sixteen and nineteen hundred eventeen are the three fiscal years in which taxes were last levied.

"That the maximum period within which the street improvement bonds aforesaid shall mature is and shall be twenty years, which is the pron-table period of the usefulness of the pprovement aforesaid.

"That special assessments upon properties benefited and a tax sufficient to pay the principal and interest of the bonds aforesaid shall be annually fevied and collected. "That this ordinance shall take effect upon its passage and shall not be submitted to the voters."

The foregoing ordinance was passed on its first reading on the 7th day of August, 1917, and was passed on its second and final reading on the 14th day of August, 1917, and was first published on the 20th day of August, 1917.

Any action or proceeding questioning the validity of this ordinance must be commenced within thirty days after its last publication.


