"Whereas, public safety and conrenience require the permanent improvement of the roads, streets and highways including the sidewalks, of the City of Hickory.

(a) That the city treasurer has filed with the city managen, exofficio city clerk a statement of the debt of the "City of Hickory" pur-suant to the "Municipal Finance Act of 1917," and that same statement is now in the office of the city man-ager and is open to public inspec-

(b) That the average assessed valuation of property subject to taxation by the "City of Hickory" for the years nineteen hundred fourteen, nineteen hundred fifteen and nineteen hundred sixteen is two million, one hundred eighty-one thousand, six hundred forty-two do'lars, and sixty-six and two-thirds cents (8,181,642.66 2-3), as is shown by said statement.


