SCHOOL ORDINANCE

Be it Ordained: That any child or person, living outside of the corporate limits of the City or for any other reason not entitled to free attendance to the city schools, shall not be permitted to attend the graded school of the city, without first having obtained and presented to the principal or other person in charge of the school, a written statement signed by the City Manager, setting forth that the tuition for such child or person has been paid in advance for the current month. That, in the event a statement, signed by the teacher in charge of the grade to which such child or person has been assigned, setting forth that such child or person during the month immediately preceding was absent by reason of sickness for a period in excess of five successive school days, is presented to the City Manager, he shall allow a credit for such time in issuing the statement or receipt for the next month. That the City Manager shall not issue any statement or receipt until he has received the amount of the tuition from time to time prescribed by the City Council. That any parent, child, teacher, school or city official, or other person, violating any provision of this ordinance shall be subject to and shall pay a penalty of twenty dollars.

COMMODORE PERRY IS HONORED BY JAPANESE

Newport, R. I., Sept. 17.—The Japanese mission to the United States came here to do homage at the grave of Commodore Matthew Galbraith Perry, who opened the door of the island empire to the influences of western civilization 64 years ago. 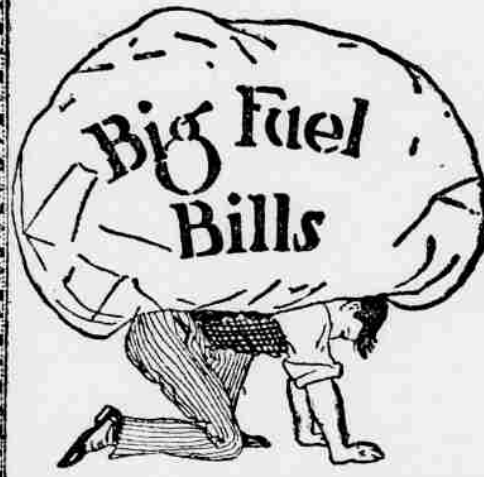
