TO AROUSE SENTIMENT AGAINST THE SENATORS

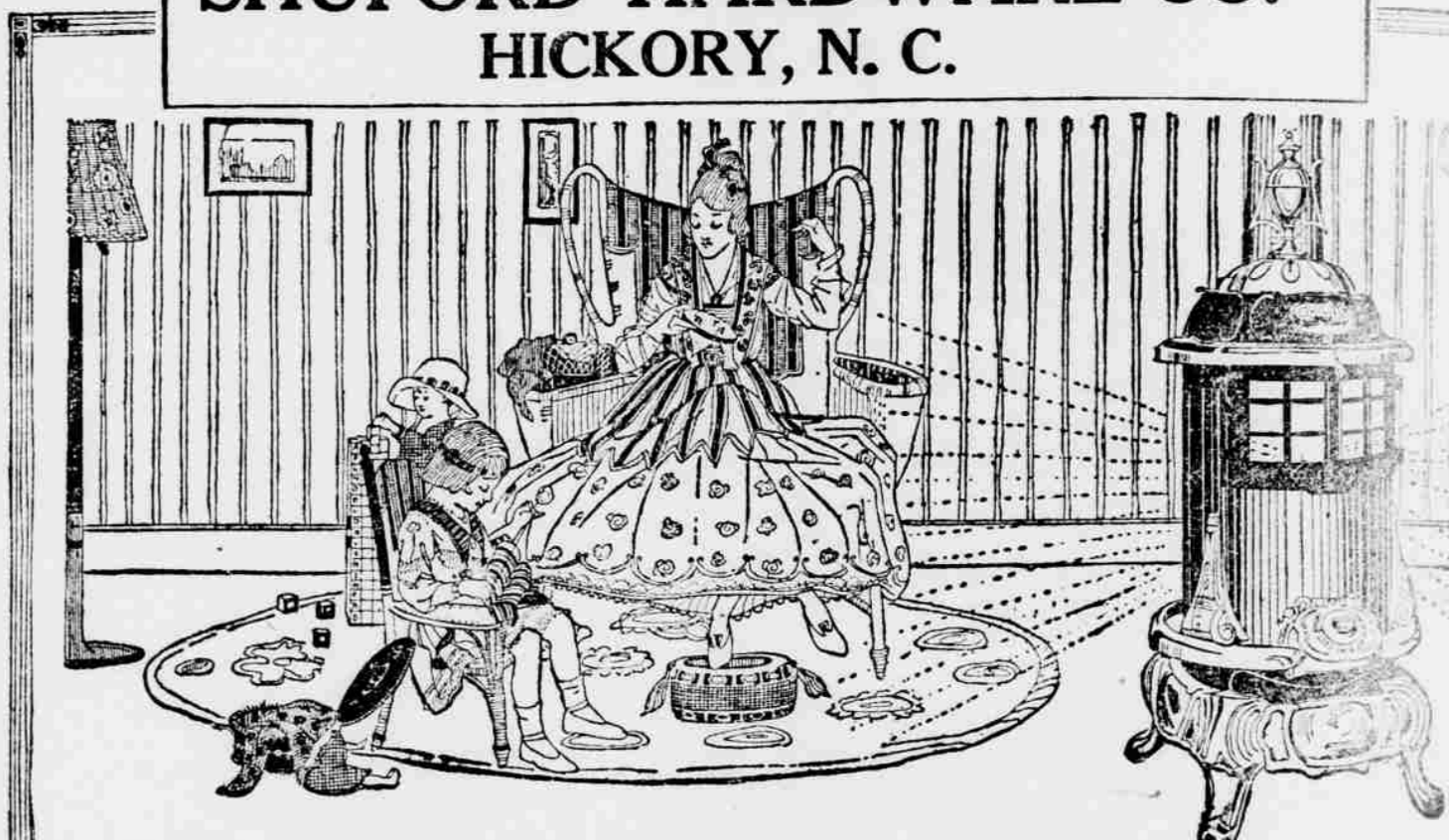
New York, Oct. 1.—In an open letter to the governors of the United States made public here, the executive committee of the American Defense Society urged that "steps should be taken at once to recall the United States senate of those men who by their seditious utterances are giving aid and comfort to Germany."

"The public remarks and the votes of Senators Stone, Reed, LaFollette, Gore, Gronna, Vardaman and Harwick," the letter stated, "clearly show their willful obstruction, seditious, if not indeed treasonable, tactics."

Each governor was asked to "arouse public sentiment through an appeal to the fathers, mothers, wives and sisters of men at the front," in his state.

PROOF OF GERMAN PURPOSE after the commencement of hostilities. Her move on Paris will be but a step to her real object—the crushing of England. Some months after we finish our work in Europe we will take New York and probably Washington, and hold them for some time. We will put your country in its place with reference to Germany. We do not purpose to take any of your territory, but we do intend to take a billion or so of your dollars from New York and other places. The Monroe doctrine will be taken charge of by us, and we will dispose of South America as we wish. Don't forget this, about 15 years from now. There the report has lain in the naval archives ever since. "About 15 years from now" was 1913. Germany intended to launch her attack in that year, as is proved by the revelations made by the Italian government of the proposals made to it to join in an invasion of Serbia in that year. Italy refused, but the invasion was made in 1914. "We will put your country in its place," said Von Goetz in 1898. "After the war America had better look out," said the kaiser to Ambassador Gerard in 1915. Any man who still says that this war is not a war of self-defense, a war against invasion, is either proof against facts by reason of the construction of his brain or has full possession of his reasoning power and is serving the enemy.

LOCAL DAIRY WILL NOT DELIVER LONGER

Without any notice except that given through the Record this afternoon, the Maple Spring Dairy, which has been furnishing the larger part of the milk to Hickory people, has ceased the delivery of its product and old customers will now seek new connections. On Friday cards were sent out to patrons asking if they would be willing to pay 12 1-2 cents a quart, an increase of 2 1-2 cents, and it is inferred that a majority answered no. The milk will be shipped from here to Charlotte. Mr. A. O. Mitchell, manager of the Catawba Cooperative Creamery, announced this afternoon that the creamery beginning tomorrow would begin the sale and deliver of pasteurized milk in Hickory at the price of 12 1-2 cents a quart. All the

germs will be killed by the pasteurizing process and the creamery milk will be as pure as any to be had. All persons who desire this milk should notify the creamery.
