

With the men back in billets, it now is permitted to mention for the first time that the casualties were n glible. In fact, more men are suffering with "trench feet" than with wounds.

From a military standpoint, the experience gained by the Americans is considered of a very high value in the training of contingents which are yet to arrive on French sou. It was a tired, dirty wet, mud-caked body of men that returned to billets. The men had only two clear days while in the trenches. They were muddy all over.


