MARTIN LUTHER'S WAY

Columbia State. The people of South Carolina, if they could but remember the memory of Martin Luther, the greatest of all the Protestant reformers, could best give evidence of that desire by putting in to Statewide operation, through enactment of the general assembly of 1918, of a compulsory school attendance system. In the noble editorial review of the life of Luther printed in the State yesterday (we are guilty of no self-laudation in so describing it as it was written for the State by Dr. George B. Cromer) his advocacy of 400 years ago of the duty of the State to train children by the exercise of compulsion upon their parents is emphasized and in these four centuries no clearer and stronger argument in favor of it has ever been set forth.

The State quotes again from Luther's letter to Elector John: "I maintain that the civil authorities are under obligation to compel the people to send the children to school. For our rulers are certainly bound to maintain the spiritual and secular offices and callings, so that there may always be preachers, jurists, pastors, scribes, physicians, schoolmasters and the like; for the government can compel such citizens as are fit for military service to bear spear and rifle, to mount ramparts and perform other martial duties in time of war, how much more has it the right to compel the people to send their children to school, because in this case we are warring with the devil, whose object it is secretly to destroy their strong men, to destroy the kernel and leave a shell of ignorant and helpless people, whom he can sport and juggle with at pleasure; this is starving out a city or country, destroying it without a struggle and without its knowledge."

The people of South Carolina have frivelled long enough with the serious subjects of education. Under the leadership of Governor Manning they have made a start, but the progress has not been so rapid in compulsory training as was hoped and the time has come when our commonwealth must go forward as a people of trained and informed intelligence or be content to be classed among the backward states, not only of this country, but of the civilized world.

A state in which a considerable element of the citizens are illiterate can not hope to keep step with advanced peoples in these times and the opportunity to go forward will never be more favorable than it is now nor will ever again be necessary to rescue the state from the disease of illiteracy be more urgent.

The general assembly of 1918 will be recreant in its duty if it shall neglect the great cause of popular education or shall palter with it. The one and only way to solve it is Dr. Martin Luther's way.

GIVE ALLEGED PRO-GERMAN COAT OF TAR AND FEATHERS

Lansing, Mich., Nov. 3.—After being given a mock trial at which he was accused of pro-Germanism, William Saier, 56 years old, well known citizen here, was tarred and feathered last night by a group of more than 25 men clad in white robes. Saier was seized about two blocks from his home by six men who pushed him into an automobile and drove to a golf link two miles away where a score or more men were waiting. After the assault, Saier was driven back within a block of his home and deposited on the sidewalk. The police have located several persons who saw the kidnapping, but have no clue to the identity of the band. Saier himself refused to make any statement, even to the police.
