



School houses in the country are aphere last week with Mr. Fisher's parently more to blame than those in the city. Overheating at times, underheating at times and underventilation all the time were the three

conditions most at fault. "School houses must be made more than air tight boxes," says the state board of health. "A safe temperature is one kept around 70 degrees by the thermometer. No school room should be without good thermometer and it should be the duty of some one to see that the temperature at no time rises far above or below 70 degrees. This legree of temperature is recommenled for the children's minds as well is their health. They feel better and work better when not too warm. This degree of heat is sufficient to keep every one warm and comforable provided they are properly lothed, and at the same time will revent their chilling when they go ut into the open air.

"Nothing is more important in the choolroom than fresh air. Ventilaion is more essential than books Every school should have some arangements whereby fresh air can e admitted freely without chilling he pupils. Fortunately for the chool children of North Carolina, ecause of our mild climate this can e done, through the windows, espeially if the windows are provided vith deflectors. These are wide oards or pieces of glass as long as he window is wide placed slantwise front of an open window on the ll, which turn the current of air pward into the room, thus avoidng drafts or direct currents. Winows should be kept lowered from School rooms should be ell aired out at each recess.

"Of course good lighting which omes only from plenty of windows especially important to avoid eye trains and inefficient work. No deent school will now tolerate the ommon towel or the common drinkng cup, neither will it have other han sanitary toilets. Provision hould be made for washing ands after each recess."

SHIPBUILDING AFTER THE WAR Nautical Gazette.

The demand for ships will not end with the cessation of hostilities; it should, indeed, be of greater magnitude than is generally believed, for many of the older vessels now impressed into service must be relegated to the scrapheap while the wastage of war as it effects vessels of all classes, must be made good. It by no means certain that tandardized vessels, soon to be launched in large numbers, will meet the needs PHONE of commerce under conditions peace, although they are well suited to meet the emergencies of war. Many new fields of trade, now lying fallow, must be entered, and these will require vessels of special type, designed and altered from time to time as experience demands. Moreover, our yards may expect orders from other countries for tonnage to which must be added the requirement of our own passenger traffic throughout the world.

One result of the activities of the emergency fleet corporation's engineers, in combination with those of the shipbuilding companies has been elimination of much unskilled labor modern machinery. Hence, steel and coal abundant and virtually at the back door of the wards, our ship-builders may look for a period of real competition and have little fear of being underbid in the mar-The old theory that shipbuilding is an art handed down from one generation to another no longer holds Not only in the United

States, but in other countries, men who knew nothing about the building of ships four years ago, are are launching vessels today, and we are witnessing a revolution in the industry and may flatter ourselves that new methods created on this side of the Atlantic will supplant those in vogue before the war

AN ARMISTIC WAS AGREED TO SATURDAY, SAYS BERLIN

Amsterdam, Dec. 4.-An armistice was agreed to Saturday with the Russian army, according to a Berlin dispatch. It was to begin at 10 o'clock on the evening of Sunday, when hostilities were to be stopped and arrangements made concerning intercourse between the lines, troop movements in the trenches and work and air activity. Forty-eight hours' notice was fixed for denunciation of the armistice. which covers the territory from the south bank of the Pripet to south of the Lipa.

VLADIMIR SCHNEUR ALSO WORKED IN SAN FRANCISCO San Francisco, Dec. 4.-Vladimir Scheneur, said to have been a German spy, and now a member of the Bolsheviki peace commission, was formerly a waiter and elevator operator in San Francisco, according to the Russian consul-general. Schneur had been here an exile rom Russia, about a year previous to he revolution which deposed former Czar Nicholas, attaches of the con-

sulate said. During the time he was here, Schnuer continued his activities in behalf of the Russian revolution, and was a prominent leader of the San Francisco society for cooperation with the Russian revolution, it was said at the consulate. Nearly all members of the society have since returned to Russia.
