A WORLD APPEAL

President Wilson's address to congress, in which he urges a declaration of war against Austria-Hungary, is rightly regarded as the most remarkable state paper contributed by this most remarkable man.

The president again speaks for the liberal sentiment of the world when he declares that the United States and the allies do not want to destroy the German empire; if his words do not burn with the indignation of the words of British and French statesmen it is because our country fortunately has not suffered as their countries, it is because our lands have not been devastated and our men and women carried into slavery and worse.

The United States will not make peace until the wrongs of these injured nations and people, including Serbia and Rumania, are righted, and the German people can have peace the minute they are willing to make good the terrible wrongs committed in the name of their masters.

In a larger way, the address is an appeal to the liberal sentiment of the world, a bid to the people of all nations to prevent the establishment and perpetuity of such a monster, a Thing, as he calls it, from drawing its evil tentacles around the throats of the world.

TELLING THE WORLD

The importance of President Wilson's address was not over-emphasized and it was well that it should have been placed in reach of every nation under the sun on the day of its delivery.

"British fleet dares Germans to come out." Headline. There is no use of the German fleet emerging after its great victory over the British at Skagerrack.

A HINT TO RUSSIA
President Wilson's address to congress was timely in another respect. It declared that the United States would not make peace with Germany until the German people had responsible rulers, and until the Germans had receded from the territory they had obtained by conquest.

Hon. W. E. Chandler, who as secretary of the navy under President Arthur is said to have done much to establish the modern American navy, is best known in the south for his work in the Tilden-Hayes presidential contest.

American troops are supposed to be near Nancy, within striking distance of Germany through Lorraine. Some military critics believe it is at this point that the great battles of 1918 will be fought.

Mr. Bryan Caldwell, who is on a visit to Newton from Michigan, brings word that the west is brimming with patriotism and that the fellow who is not supporting the government is not considered a good citizen.

Capt. F. M. Jordan, who investigated the fire that destroyed the Salisbury graded school building, reported that there was evidence that gamblers had been using the building.

Iredell county has sold its issue of bridge bonds to a Charlotte bank and there is no trouble about the bridges.

Since the Record has been about the only paper to protest with the Statesville Landmark over the remarks of Herr Williams, we felt justified in indulging in a bit of levity.

In the declaration of war against Austria-Hungary, we have been told, there will be only one dissenting note—Representative London Meyer, Socialist. Miss Jeanette Rankin, the woman representative, will cast her vote in the affirmative, we are told. Well, we can see pretty soon.

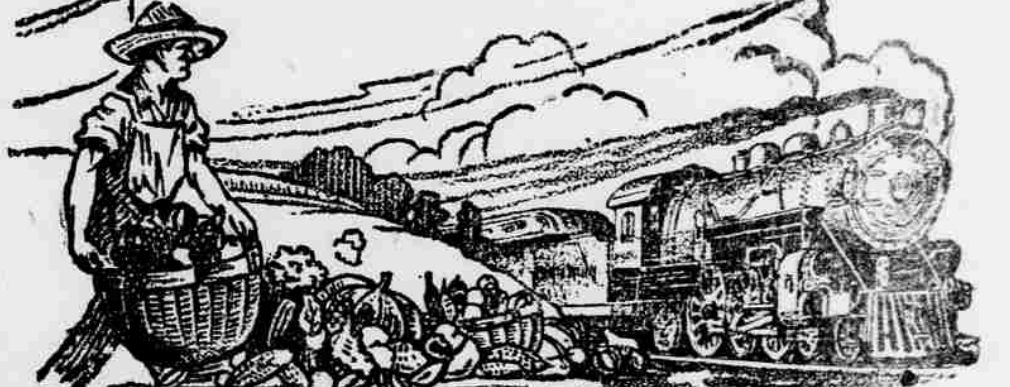
