

FIFTEEN SOLDIERS FACING COURT-MARTIAL FOR MUTINY

San Antonio, Tex., Dec. 7.-Fifcen members of the sixth cavalry went to trial before a court-martial at Fort Sam Houston on charges of EASILY RECOGNIZED mutiny growing out of an alleged efusal to obey an order to drill September 25, when they were sta-tioned in the Big Bend district. The personnel of the court is the same as that which tried the 63 negroes of the 24th infantry for muiny in connection with the Hous-

ton riot, and Col. J. A. Hull is cting as judge advocate. It is alleged the men refused obey the orders to drill, saying that they were worn out after long siege of guard duty.

BUSINESS REPORTED ACTIVE THROUGHOUT THE COUNTRY Washington, Dec. 7.—Business as reported active throughout the country by the federal reserve board in its monthly business summary. Industries were declared to be busy in every reserve district but construction work, building and gineering was dull owing partly to the approach of cold weather and partly to the shortage of labor. Nearly everywhere the labor situation was pronounced unsatisfactory with a marked shortage of men and 'abnormally high wages. Bank clearings increased in all districts but in New York and Minneapolis.


