

Practical education was his idea and his methods of teaching was unusual and inspirational. Discipline was enforced, for at a Patton academy there was scant time for frivolity or devilment. The boys in addition to being well grounded in the coentrals of a practical education were developed as debaters. In all things was the effort made to fit them for public strvice.


