CATAWBA COLLEGE
TO RAISE \$300,000

The board of trustees of Catawba College after a careful consideration of the needs of the institution and after a study of the forward movement allotment passed the following action:

1. To place the college on an accredited basis and to maintain the institution as such requires \$300,000 as a minimum amount for endowment. The board commits itself in its most united effort to raise this amount within five years, the same to terminate with the forward movement period.
2. Since the forward movement has allotted \$125,000 as the share the institution is to receive, and since this amount is inadequate for the maintenance of the institution the board appeals for supplementary contributions from individuals who will be disposed to aid causes beyond their contributions to the general budget of the forward movement.
3. To guarantee the full amount of \$300,000 the board appoints a committee who shall effect such organization and carry forward such a campaign by which to secure the full amount, the effort to follow the termination of the canvass period of the forward movement in April, 1920.
4. The board calls upon all pastors and consistories and unites with the same in securing annually an equivalent of 500 members to the Catawba College league until the endowment fund shall have been raised.

FRANCE TO REMAIN
SILENT ON WILSON

Paris, March 15—The French government has not and will not send any instructions to Ambassador Jusserand in Washington regarding President Wilson's charges of militarism against France, it was stated at the foreign office this morning. The ambassador stated on his own initiative he called upon Under Secretary of State Polk and told him of the surprise in France at the president's statement.

The ambassador said he made no representations.

No comment was expressed in official circles as to whether President Wilson would take the occasion to correct the impression made in France.

DEATH OF YOUNG MAN
Mr. Garland Deal, son of Mr. and Mrs. Nathan Deal, died at his home near Catawba Springs yesterday afternoon at 5 o'clock at the age of 20 years. Influenza and pneumonia was the cause of death. The deceased was a splendid young man and his death has caused much sorrow among a wide circle of friends. The funeral was held this afternoon at 3 o'clock by Rev. M. F. Kuegele.

Mrs. Tate Bowman, a daughter of Mr. Deal, is desperately ill with pneumonia following an attack of influenza and Mrs. Deal and a small daughter are ill with influenza but not seriously.

FUNERAL OF COLONEL YODER
Funeral services over the remains of Col. George Monroe Yoder, whose death occurred suddenly Saturday morning at the age of nearly 94 years, were held on the grounds of Grace Lutheran church at 3 o'clock yesterday afternoon. Rev. L. L. Lohr, his pastor, in charge. A large congregation was present and it was decided to conduct the rites in the open air in order that the people might witness them. Many relatives and friends were present from Hickory, Newton and other parts of the county.
