In accordance with petition duly presented to the Board of Elections said board in Newton, on Saturday, for Catawba county, at meeting of April 17, 1920, a change in the voting places in Hickory township, Catawba county, is hereby made, same to become effective at once which said change in said precincts and voting places is as follows:

NORTH-WEST HICKORY PRECINCT.

To embrace a territory north of the Southern Railroad, and west of a line running from the intersection of 13th street and the railroad, with said street to 10th avenue, thence with said avenue East to 12th street; thence with said street North to 15th avenue; thence with said avenue East to the river road, Moore's Ferry road; thence with said road Northward to the Catawba-Alexander Iron Bridge, with polling places at the City Hall in Hickory.

NORTH-EAST HICKORY PRECINCT.

To embrace a territory North of the Southern Railroad and east of a line running with the intersection of 13th street and the railroad, with said street to 13th avenue; thence with said avenue East to 12th street; thence with said street North to 15th avenue; thence with said avenue East to the River road, Moore's Ferry road; thence with said road Northward to the Catawba-Alexander Iron Bridge, with polling places at Chamber of Commerce in Hickory.

SOUTH-EAST HICKORY PRECINCT.

To embrace a territory south of the Southern Railroad north of the Henry Fork of the South Fork River and East of a line running from the intersection of 12th street and the Southern Railroad, with said street and the Brookford Road to the Brookford Bridge, with polling place at J. P. Burns' Store in Hickory.

SOUTHWEST HICKORY PRECINCT.

Embracing the territory South of the Southern Railroad North of Henry's Fork of the South Fork River and West of a line running from the intersection of 12th street and the railroad, with the intersection of 12th street and the railroad, with said street and the Brookford Road, to the Brookford Bridge, with polling place on 9th avenue between 12th and Federal streets in Hickory.

CAPITAL AND FREEDOM

Wall Street Journal. Few if any of our advocates of a single tax remember that in Britain the crown, the state, is the only absolute landholder. All land is held in fee to the crown. In the event of the death of the holder without heirs it reverts to the crown. Note that the law says "reverts," acknowledging thereby that individual ownership is only conditional. Every land holding, in fact, was felt under military tenure; the system was exactly what Lenin proposes to restore today, and what the German junkers, shrewd enough to see its exact correspondence with the feudalism they understand, would establish in Germany. From the time of William the Conqueror and the "Domesday Book" (1086) to the termination of the wars with France, nearly 500 years later, ownership of land involved a military service so onerous that only oppression of the present made it workable. The constant demand for men and supplies was ruinous. The great trading cities built on those rains, because the urban plot of land necessary to do business was so small that the military service involved was negligible. It could always be commuted, in dealing with kings chronically hard pressed for money. It will be seen that the soviet idea, like the socialist idea, with the crude communism which it involves, so far from embodying any novelty, to say nothing of any extension of democracy, is merely a return to a discarded system of slavery. It was capital, as represented by the free cities, that was always the friend of liberty, enlightenment and progress is that capital stands for freedom throughout the ages. Freedom is the last thing the bolshevist wants. He does not even understand the meaning of the word.
