DIES IN CALDWELL FROM GUN WOUNDS

Lenoir, March 22—Jacob Carlton died yesterday from gunshot wounds said to have been inflicted by his brother-in-law, Jule Coswell. Coswell is being held in jail here pending preliminary hearing. The hearing will be sometime this week it is believed.

The shooting arose over a fuss between Carlton and his wife who was Coswell's sister. Coswell is alleged to have said that he shot Carlton because he was beating his sister. The tragedy occurred Friday night at Carlton's home about two miles southwest of here. Coswell was living with his brother-in-law and remained there after the shooting until sheriff Triplett arrived and placed him under arrest.

This is the second family row and killing that has taken place in that section of the county in the past few months. The first tragedy occurred when Hardin Mabe went on the war-path and killed his brother-in-law, Phillip King, and another neighbor by the name of Tom Winkler. Mabe then shot himself.

Bud Childers and Berry Lefevers were bound over yesterday by justice of the Peace J. A. Bush on the charge of hold up and robbery. The two men were charged with holding up and robbing John Price between Lenoir and Whiteside Sunday night. Price testified that he was knocked down and robbed.

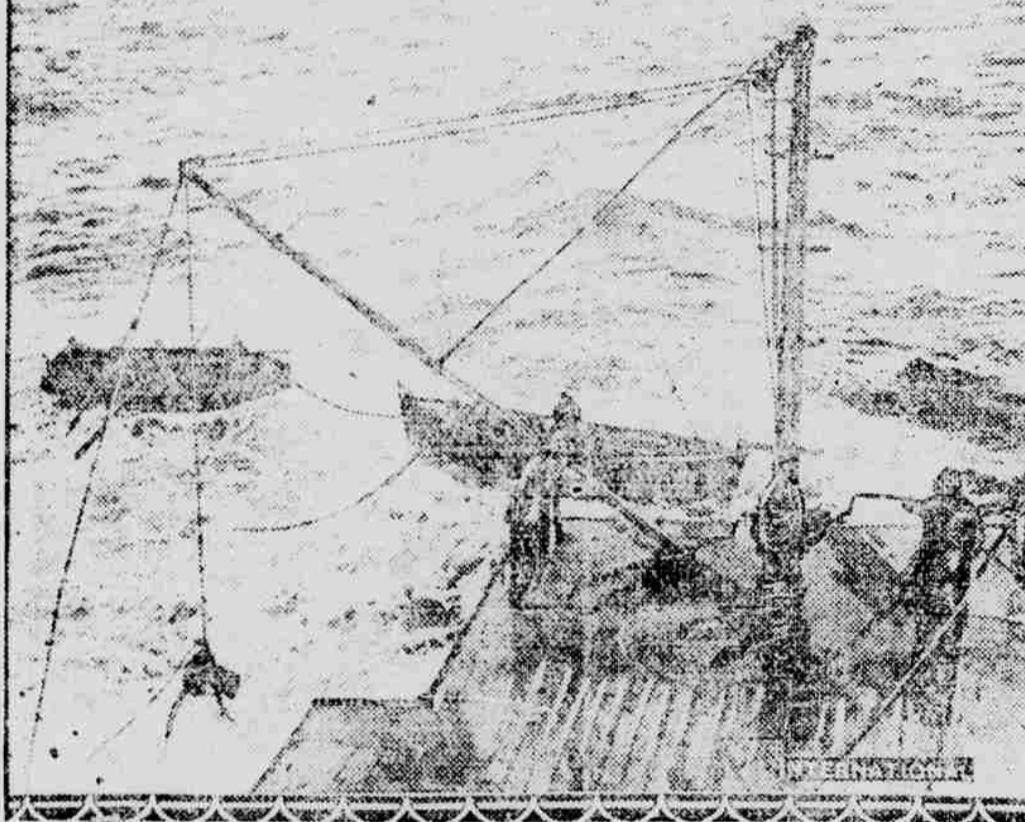

Luncheon in Medinet Hobu Temple



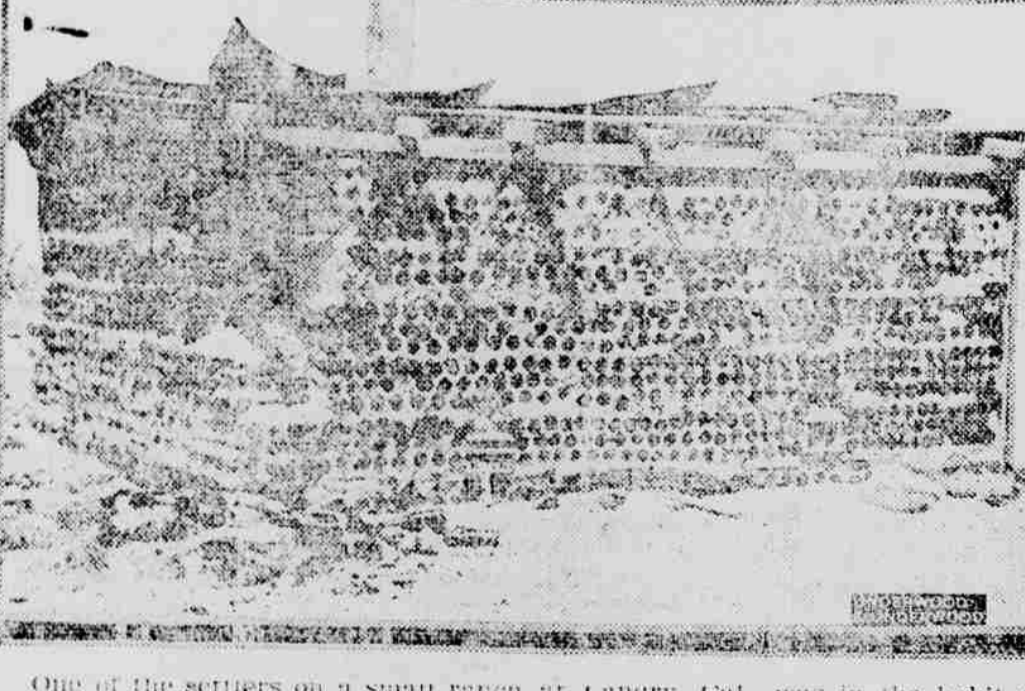

Landing Relief Crew at Wolf Rock



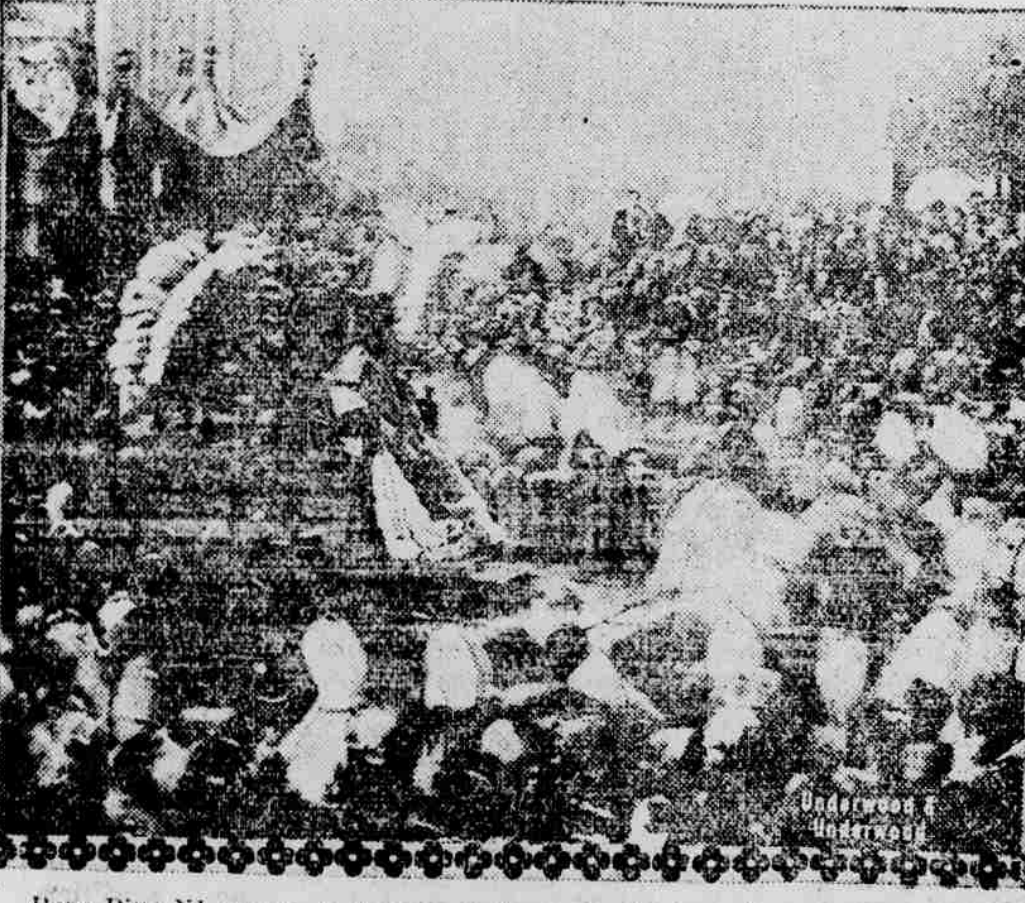
