SOME SCHOOL FACTS

There are some things that the voters of Hickory have a right to know about. These include everything connected with their government, for Hickory belongs to the people who live here, pay taxes and telp to make the municipality pos-

The Record has heard that the charge is being made that the city is paying for the maintenance of the teacherage, the home where the teachers live. The teachers are paying for it themselves-footing all the bills for rent, and laundry and everything. Some cities may provide these things, but Hickory is not doing it. If in doubt, ask Miss Morrell or any of the teachers.

The Record has also heard that the charge is made that the salaries of teachers is too high here, and that the city is responsible. Any person who wants the facts could write to the state superintendent of public instruction and receive them. The state of North Carolina, which pays one-third of the salaries of superintendents, principals and teachers of schools which meet state requirements, fixes the salaries. Any school board which wants to retain firs class teachers and share in the state's equilization fund must conform to requirements made by the state department of Education,

If Hickory did not meet the state requirements, it would be compened to pay almost, if not, as much as other towns pay, and it would have to raise all the money by its lonesome

CHICKENS AND GARDENS

A Record subscriber, who has new lawn and some garden truck. suggests that this paper call atten tion to the fact that it is a misde meanor to allow chickens to run at large if they bother other people That is the state law. One may catch and hold chickens for ransom, as it were, but it is unlawful to kill them.

The owners of depredating fowls may be given notice and if they fail keep their chickens penned, ther they may be indicted. The best way handle the depredating fowl is to a trap for him and then proceed the extraction of the coin of the alm from the owner. That is : good remedy.

That there will continue to be two big political parties was indicated in the special election in the third Maine congressional district Monday where the Republican candidate won by about 6,000 majority. Congressman Peters, who resigned to accept a judgeship, was elected in 1920 by over 19,000 majority. There was of course very much less interest in this special election than there was in the last general election, and probably thousands of voters, many of them women, remained away from the polls. The result appears merely as indication that thousands who voted the Republican ticket in this district have returned to the Democratic party.

BETTER REGISTER

Citizens of Hickory who have not registered for the municipal election would do well to see that their names are on the registration books. Many women registered last fall for the general election, but that registration does not count in the city pri mary oand election. There is considerable interest in the primary Mon day and a large vote probably wil' he cast. If for any reason, new voters are not enrolled before Friday night, when the books close, they will be given another opportunity next week, beginning Tuesday. The candidates will run in the election a week from Monday, since there can be no elimination where there ar fewer than three candidates.
