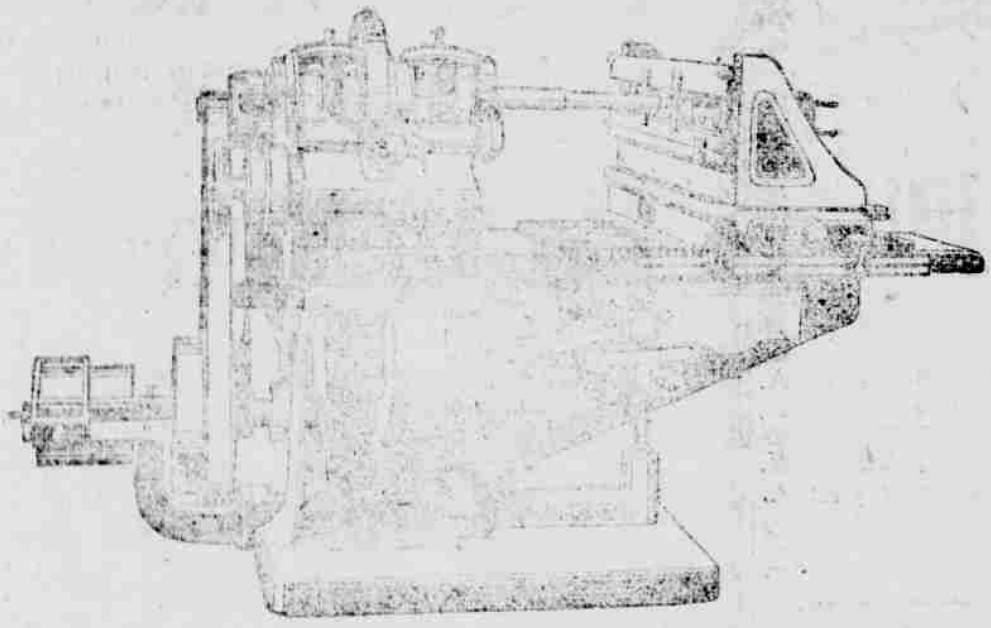

B. F. Smith, graduate of Georgia School of Technology and graduate work of Tulane University, with experience as teacher, will be in charge of college mathematics.

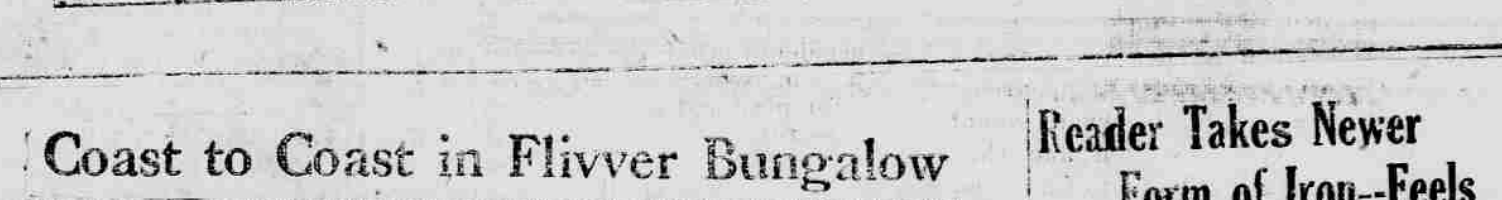
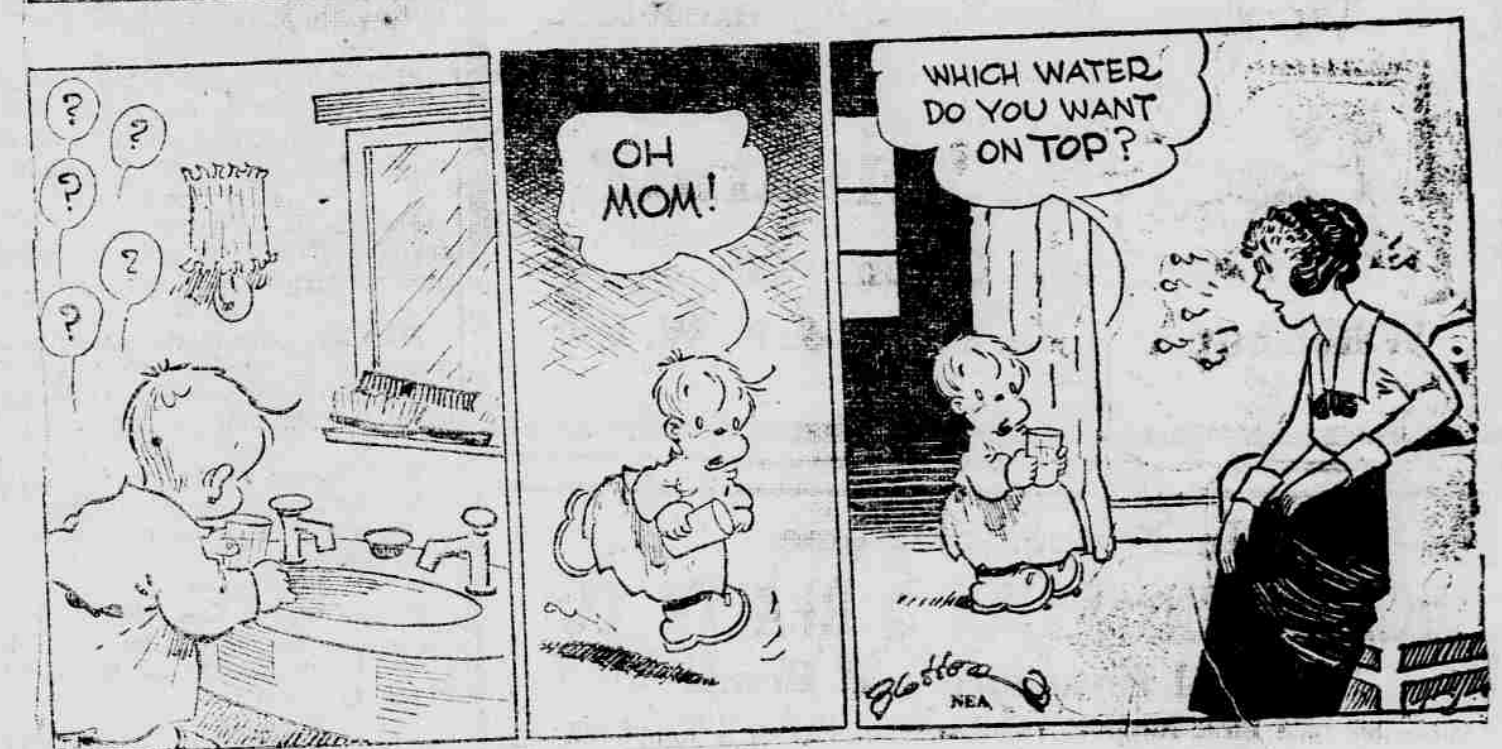

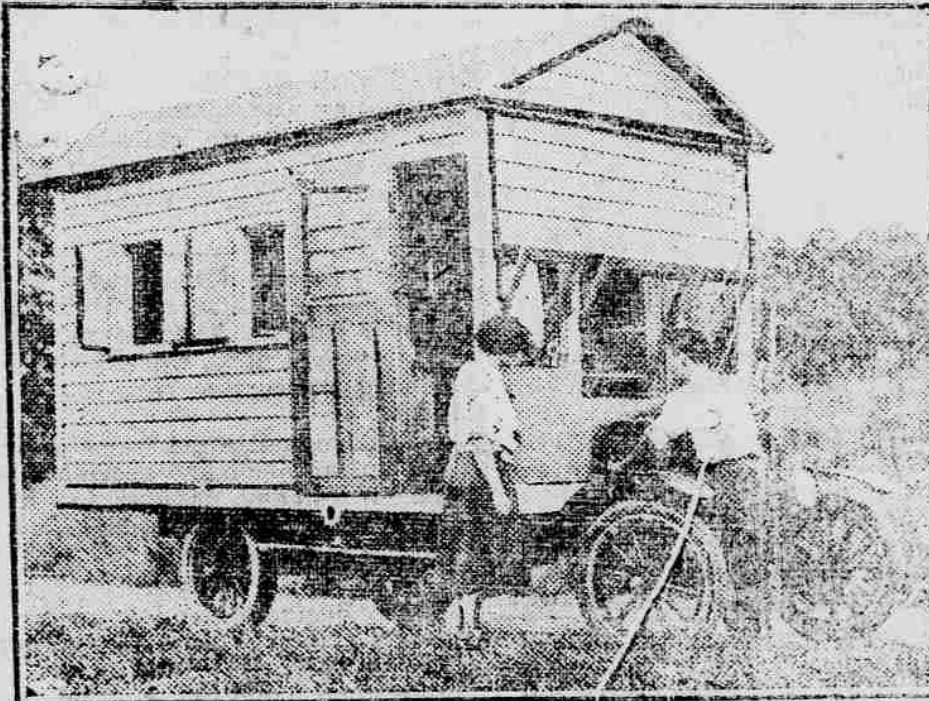
Mrs. Sarah E. Hume of Pennsylvania, graduate of the Phoebe Conservatory of Music will have as voice and piano teacher.
